

- In 1955, Grady Littlejohn got permission from the City of McKinney to start a girls' softball program.
- Grady Littlejohn ran concessions for the City of McKinney for over 20 years. He was the first concessionaire to run concessions at the Wilson Creek Softball/Baseball Complex.
- Grady Littlejohn passed away on January 11, 2013.
- Due to the overwhelming responses from the online submittal to name the 16-acre neighborhood park site at 1849 Reagan Drive, the PROS Board requested staff to bring the name, Grady Littlejohn, back at a future PROS Board meeting.
- The PROS Board felt that naming the 16-acre park site, which does not have ball fields or concessions, after Grady Littlejohn was not appropriate. The Board felt it was more appropriate to rename a facility with ball fields and concessions after Grady Littlejohn.
- On July 14, 2016, the PROS Board voted to recommend to the City Council that the Wilson Creek Softball/Baseball Complex be renamed the Grady Littlejohn Softball/Baseball Complex.
- Policy allows the PROS Board to make a recommendation to the City Council regarding naming of park facilities.
