BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- In July 2020, the McKinney City Council approved a resolution establishing the Throckmorton Statue Ad Hoc Advisory Board.

- The purpose of the Ad Hoc Advisory Board is to:
 - advise staff in performing expert research related to the context, appropriateness, and relevancy of the Throckmorton statue and
 - ensure that the community is engaged in the discussion so that the City Council may be presented with thorough and balanced research and options regarding the statue and other cultural artifacts located on City-owned property.
- The Throckmorton Statue Ad Hoc Advisory Board provided review, advice, and oversight of staff research related to the Throckmorton Statue. This research resulted in a thorough and balanced report to the City Council on the historical context, artistic value, appropriateness, and relevancy of the Throckmorton statue.
