- MCDC Partnership Request: \$305,000
- Total Project Cost: \$405,000
- Demolish & Plan Development for New Construction (611 Bumpas)
- Repair & Renovate Home (305 Lively Hill)
- Demolish & Rebuild Home (1304 Garcia)
- All properties located in high-poverty, predominantly minority census tracts
