
Confirmed Wildlife Sightings in the Heard Sanctuary

Blackland Prairie Ecosystem

- Originally more than
 170,000,000 acres from Kansas to San Antonio
- Less than .05% remains
- The Most Endangered Ecosystem in the Western Hemisphere
- The Heard maintains approximately 60 acres



Trail Improvement and Repair

Trail improvement and repair through a large section of the Blackland Prairie is needed. This is one area that was damaged by flooding and is located in a frequently used area.





Tractor

Our tractor is more than 25 years old and can no longer safely traverse the grounds or clear trails easily. It is continually in need of costly repairs.





Replacement SRC Deck

This element is heavily used by the public and is a key point of observation for the primary restoration site for this project. It is in major disrepair and needs to be replaced.





The Request: \$143,810

(\$24,190 Already Raised of \$168,000 total Prairie Visitor Experience Restoration Project Budget)

A new tractor with biosystems-friendly attachments: that can manage the varying terrain within the Sanctuary is essential and will be used continually for years to come. To use it optimally, tractor attachments must accompany it and include: a bush hog, which is a type of rotary mower commonly used for agricultural and land management tasks; and a tow-behind 200-gallon sprayer

SRC Observation deck Repair: used by students and teachers visiting on field trips, by scouting groups, families, homeschoolers, and people attending special events such as weddings and corporate gatherings. The deck was built <u>30</u> years ago, but because of normal wear and tear brought on by heavy use it is time to replace it with new decking and safety railing.

<u>Materials for Trail Restoration</u>: The Heard wishes to purchase: 1) flexible course base material made from crushed rock (FlexBase) to replace decomposed granite; and 2) Rip Rap rock. Rip rap prevents soil erosion caused by water flow, protects valuable property, preserves natural habitats, and maintains landscape integrity.
