

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-04-XXX (R)

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCKINNEY, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, OR DESIGNEE, TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT AND IMPLEMENT AN URBAN AREA SECURITY INITIATIVE PROGRAM GRANT AWARD FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY THROUGH THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR TO ENHANCE OFFICER PROTECTION FOR THE MCKINNEY POLICE DEPARTMENT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas, (“City Council”) understands the importance of enhancing regional security and emergency preparedness; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Homeland Security’s Urban Area Security Initiative (“UASI”) provides funding to enhance regional preparedness and capabilities in designated high-threat, high-density areas; and

WHEREAS, the City of McKinney (“City”) intends to apply for a UASI grant award through the Office of the Governor, which will be used to fund the purchase of Ballistic Plates to enhance the McKinney Police Department’s preparedness and response teams; and

WHEREAS, the grant funding, if awarded, would address the National Priority Area for the protection of soft targets/crowded places; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it in the best interest of the citizens of McKinney that the 2026 UASI McKinney – Enhance Officer Protection grant be operated for the 2026 grant year (2027 Fiscal Year).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCKINNEY, TEXAS, THAT:

- Section 1. The City Council hereby approves the submission of the UASI grant application to the Office of the Governor for the grant project named, 2026 UASI McKinney - Enhance Officer Protection, to purchase ballistic plates with no required match.
- Section 2. The City Council authorizes the City Manager, or his designee, as the grant’s authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant on behalf of the City to carry out the grant objectives described herein.
- Section 3. The City Council designates the City’s Director of Finance as the grant’s financial officer. The financial officer is given the power to submit financial and/or programmatic reports or alter a grant on behalf of the applicant agency.
- Section 4. The City Council understands the City will be responsible for any cost overruns of the grant award, subject to applicable law.
- Section 5. The City Council agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Office of the Governor funds, the City of McKinney assures that the funds will be returned to the Office of the Governor in full, subject to applicable law.
- Section 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately from and after the date of passage and is so resolved.
