Dear Sir/Madam. I speak on behalf of many of my neighbors who live on the northern side of the new proposed Honey Creek Development project that goes from CR 168 to Myers Park to Erwin Park. We ask you to protect the residents of this city and reject this proposed project or at lease make it 2 acre minimum lot sizes. We oppose this project for many many reasons. Our quality of life is being taken away from us by all these developments. So many of our roads are so congested that they are almost impassable. These houses will be built faster than new roads can be built making it almost impossible even to drive to Baylor Hospital. Leave some grass, trees and cows for our kids and grandkids to enjoy. Please reject this project. One city official was quoted months ago in the Community Impact newspaper stating "we should have addressed this issue of growth 20 years ago ".
