

**RESOLUTION NO. 2026-XX-XXX (R)**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCKINNEY, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, OR DESIGNEE, TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND IMPLEMENT AN URBAN AREA SECURITY INITIATIVE PROGRAM GRANT AWARD FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY THROUGH THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR TO ENHANCE THREAT DETECTION FOR THE MCKINNEY FIRE DEPARTMENT**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas, (“City Council”) understands the importance of enhancing regional security and emergency preparedness; and

**WHEREAS**, the Department of Homeland Security’s Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) grant program provides funding to enhance regional preparedness and capabilities in designated high-threat, high-density areas; and

**WHEREAS**, the grant funding, if awarded, will be used to fund the purchase of devices that detect harmful air pollutants called volatile organic compounds (VOCs) to help monitor air safety and enhance threat detection.

**WHEREAS**, the grant funding, if awarded, would address the National Priority Area for enhancing the protection of soft targets and crowded spaces.

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds it in the best interest of the citizens of McKinney that the 2026 UASI McKinney – Enhance Threat Detection grant be operated for the 2026 grant year (2027 Fiscal Year).

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCKINNEY, TEXAS, THAT:**

Section 1. The City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas, hereby approves submission of the UASI grant application to the Office of the Governor for the grant project named, 2026 UASI McKinney – Enhance Threat Detection to purchase volatile organic compound detectors with no required match.

Section 2. The City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas, authorizes the City Manager, or designee, as the grant’s authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant on behalf of the City of McKinney to carry out the grant objectives described herein.

Section 3. The City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas, designates the Director of Finance as the grant’s financial officer. The financial officer is given the power to submit financial and/or programmatic reports or alter a grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

Section 4. The City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas, understands the City will be responsible for any cost overruns of the grant award.

Section 5. The City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Office of the Governor funds, the City assures that the funds will be returned to the Office of the Governor in full.

Section 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately from and after the date of passage and is so resolved.
