McKinney Community Development Corporation Update

• Strategic Priorities

- The MCDC board met for a strategic priority discussion at a special meeting that was held July 17. Five priorities were identified – and then ratified at the regular board meeting held July 27th. The priorities for FY 23-24 are (not in priority order):
 - Low-income housing
 - Multi-use/mixed-use/destination entertainment projects
 - Historic Cultural District and East Side development
 - Parks and Open Space development; and preservation of open space and natural areas
 - Community gathering facility/space
- Additionally, Board members affirmed a continuing commitment to working in collaboration with community partners including the city, MEDC, businesses and nonprofit organizations.

• Update on MCDC funding for strategic priorities – FY 22 and FY 23

• Attached is a recap of project grants awarded to support identified strategic priorities.

TUPPS Brewery Project

 Report from Spinelli Construction Services, MCDC Owner's Rep, is attached. Tentative date for a TCO on the Brewery Building is August 18. However, the State inspection of the elevator that was installed in the Brewery Building, cannot be conducted until August 25 or August 26 – which may delay the TCO.

• Project Grants

 Applications for FY 23, Cycle II were accepted June 1-30. Public hearings on the applications received were held at the July 27th meeting. Board action on the funding requests will be scheduled for the August 24th meeting. A summary of the applications received is provided below:

TUPPS Brewery Expansion Project – July 2023 Construction Update

SpawGlass [SG] mobilized on site February 28, 2022

There has continued to be significant slipping in the schedule. Progress continues on the project, completion dates shown above have held throughout the month of July. As has been discussed and communicated reasons for delayed completion include material delays early in construction, unknown conditions on existing structures, many items necessitating design redraws and contractor / subcontractor pricing regarding change in scope, deleting scope or adding scope and lack of final decisions, misunderstanding/confusion over what is in scope and out of scope for the contractor. Efforts continue to secure a Temporary certificate of Occupancy for the Brewery Building, while work on the remainder of the project is completed to allow brewery equipment testing/operations to begin earlier than the date of final completion. Below is a high-level recap of work progress and photos.

July 1 – July 8

Site: grading and moving big blocks, demo of curb at sidewalk, weed eating and cleanup; Brewery: Relocating radiant heaters; Tap Room: insulation of copper pipe, install doors, zip board, steel for high roof, pipe for A/C, fire sprinkler





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Brewery: ductwork, testing backflow devices, testing fire alarm devices, elevator shaft, punch list work; Tap Room: pulling wire, roof deck, insulating pipe, misc steel ; Site: dumpster gates



July 17 – July 22

Brewery: tie in radiant heaters, continue fire alarm device install, vents for radiant heaters, punch list work ; Tap Room: insulating mechanical ducts, run gas pipe, frame exterior walls



July 24 – July 31

Brewery: punch list work continues, testing of fire alarm, caulking and infill, painting stairs ; Tap Room: continue ductwork, steel, excavation for underground electric,
