Ovation Academy Programs

Full-Immersion Academy Grades 6-12 8am-4pm Monday-Friday

Using a university model, we offer full-day education which emphasizes arts integration taught by certified teachers and industry professionals. This option allows students to complete middle and high school requirements through a partnership with parents and teachers utilizing onsite mentoring and guidance. In addition, students select a major to focus their technical training and are encouraged to explore other aspects of the performing arts outside of their major through enrichment courses. This program emphasizes developing the full student and art form. Participation in community service, performances, special events and character development sessions are required for all full-immersion students.

Humanitarianism is a core value taught at Ovation Academy. We believe that philanthropy is a vital part of creating a stable community. Our students are required to participate in projects which utilize their talents and passion to make the world a better place. Through volunteer service students gain empathy and life-lessons we cannot teach in the classroom.

Full Immersion students must complete 50 hours of community volunteer hours per year including a community service project benefiting and showcasing local Non-profit organizations.

Homeschool Program Grades K-12 A la Carte Classes

Students in grades K-12 can take enrichment classes for fun, socialization or to fulfill their Fine Arts requirements! For Kindergarten- 5th grade we offer a 2 day/week Program. Grades 6-12 may select classes "Al La Carte" from our course schedule. Advanced classes require an audition.

Ovation Academy also offers after-school lessons in each discipline which are open to all passionate performers starting at various age and experience levels. After-school enrichment classes, productions and camps are offered at various times throughout the year.

Why do students choose Ovation Academy?

- Public school does not met their individual needs or goals
- Large class sizes and student body spark anxiety and depression
- The family culture on our campus is more individualized and personal, students are more than a number or test score
- Students are often beyond the level of training they can receive in public school setting
- Options in public school are limited and students are forced to take unnecessary courses

Learning Through Art

The arts can open the world of learning to students who have trouble with traditional teaching methods. The arts are intellectual disciplines - requiring complex thinking and problem solving - that offer students the opportunity to construct their own understanding of the world.

- Drawing and painting reinforce motor skills and can also be a way of learning shapes, contrasts, boundaries, spatial relationships, size and other math concepts.
- Music teaches children about rhythm, sound and pitch. Beats can help children learn rhymes and other features of reading such as phonological awareness. Using repetitive songs to learn academic facts (like the alphabet song or multiplication tables) can make the learning experience easier and more fun.
- Dance provides children with a social way to learn about sequencing, rhythm and following directions. While developing coordination and motor control, students can also learn counting and directionality, which can enhance reading and writing concepts such as understanding the difference between similar looking letters (like p/b/d/q) and telling left from right.
- Performing plays is an opportunity for children to immerse themselves in a theme and learn about it in a profound and personal way. Acting out historical or literary figures and events gives students a sense of ownership about what they've learned, allowing them to acquire a deeper appreciation of the subject matter.
- Crafts offer children the opportunity to express themselves in two- and three-dimensional ways. Students can
 develop vital problem-solving skills without having to rely on areas of expression that may be more challenging.





According to a National Arts Education Study in 2016

Performing arts students in middle and high school had a 34% chance of being bullied (more than 1 in 3) while non-arts students had only a 25% chance (1 in 4). Bullying peaks in middle school. Looking at middle schoolers alone, we found that the arts students had a 39% chance of being bullied (nearly 2 in 5), compared to only a 30% chance (less than 1 in 3) for middle school non-arts students.

Many members of the Artist Community are also members of minotiriy groups including the LGBTQ community.

How is their mental health being affected?

- Substance Use: Gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender youth are more than twice as likely to experiment with drugs and alcohol.
- Self-Harm: With each instance of verbal or physical harassment, the risk of self-harm among LGBT youth is 2 ½ times more likely.
- Suicide: Gay, lesbian, and bisexual youth are 4 times more likely to attempt suicide than their heterosexual counterparts.

How is their education being affected?

- Gay teens in U.S. schools are often subjected to such intense bullying that they're unable to receive an adequate education. LGBT youth identified bullying problems as the second most important problem in their lives, after non-accepting families, compared to non-LGBT youth identifying classes/exams/grades.
- LGBT youth who reported they were frequently harassed in school had lower grade point averages than students who were less often harassed.
- One survey revealed that more than one-third of gay respondents had missed an entire day of school in the past month because they felt unsafe there.
- LGBT youth feel they have nowhere to turn. Sixty percent of LGBT students did not report incidents to school staff. One-third who reported an incident said the staff did nothing in response.


