- Retail Development Infrastructure Grants Retail is defined as: storefronts/shops, restaurants, specialty food venues, event venues, salons, grocery stores, drug stores, etc.
 - Grants will fund infrastructure improvements for retail establishments or buildings housing retail enterprises that are <u>exterior to a property</u>, <u>necessary to promote or develop new or</u> <u>expanded business enterprises</u>.

- o Expenses eligible for consideration include:
 - Sewer
 - Water
 - Electric Utilities
 - Gas Utilities
 - Drainage
 - Lighting (for security enhancements)
 - Fencing (for security enhancements)
 - Site Improvements
 - (landscape will <u>only be considered if replacement is required due to</u> infrastructure improvements)
 - Walkways concrete or other materials
 - Parking
