Dr. Burton did his residency training at Arkansas Children's Hospital in Little Rock. He and his wife and three children have lived in McKinney since 1999 and he has actively helped in Glen Oaks Elementary, Dowell Middle School and Boyd High School supporting all their sports and other activities.

His desire to provide the best care for the children of the community is ongoing and is deeply rooted in his commitment to the families of McKinney.

Installation of drinking fountains at Fitzhugh, Wattley and Horizon Parks

Installation of drinking fountain and power at the pavilion at Old Settler's Park

Installation of 165 trees at Gabe Nesbitt ballfields, Al Ruschhaupt Soccer, and Oak Hollow Golf Course

Competed design of George Webb Park

Many other projects were started to include the All Abilities Playground (in conjunction with the McKinney Rotary Club) which was slated to open in November but due to flooding has been delayed until Spring 2019.

Parks provides many activities that we are all familiar with: Daddy Daughter Dance, Towne Lake Trout Derby, Easter Egg Splash, and Red, White, and Boom to name a few.

Parks and Rec also provides services many of us are not aware of. It provides a collection of programs for special needs individuals to include a Special Needs Prom, Adult Special Needs Social Nights, gym space for McKinney Magic Athletics Teams (a delegation with Special Olympics), and Special Needs Outdoor Movies which encourages singing and dancing.

There are also many cultural events to include a Cultural Music Series that includes Irish, African, and Latin musicians. Gender Neutral activities such as Kids in the Kitchen was also established to facilitate more diverse social interactions.

The Apex Centre has also been a success with its accomplishment to be self-funding which it accomplished in its first year (expected to take three years). At its peak this year it recorded over 60,000 visits in a single month.

Parks partnered with Craig Ranch to relocate 23 mature Crape Myrtles to Gabe Nesbitt Park. This project resulted in \$143,000 in net, positive value to the park's tree inventory.

Finally, Parks has created a Senior Center that fosters an environment that allows its seniors to enjoy music, exercise, field trips, and meals. The Senior Center provides dances each Monday. Many seniors have found a love connection during this activity. Pickle Ball is another event that is hosted at the Senior Center. This too has become a popular event for McKinney's Seniors.

I cannot say enough about the Parks & Recreation Department of McKinney. This department is always doing its best to meet the demands of a fast-growing community not only in its park acreage but also in its services and classes. Parks personnel spend countless hours preparing for events, cleaning up after floods, and most importantly proving McKinney is one of the Best Places to Live in America.


