North Central Texas Council of Governments Regional Transit 2.0 Highlights

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Background Information

- North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) developed the Collin County Transit Study to assess the existing conditions and develop public transportation strategies for the future.
- In May 2025, NCTCOG released the final report of the Regional Transit 2.0 study.
- Key findings of the study:
 - Future transit service offerings in Collin County
 - Near Term (1-5 years): Paratransit, demand response/microtransit
 - Mid-Term (5-10 years): Fixed-route bus, premium bus
 - Long-Term (10+ years): Regional rail, high-capacity transit, automated transportation system/people movers



Key Findings

- Finding 1: Sustainable funding and increased efficiency of transit services are both necessary to optimally guide projected growth and development trends
- Finding 2: Economic development, density, and transit-oriented development are critical for effective regional transit
- Finding 3: Transit must be competitive with other modes of travel to provide effective mobility and reduce regional congestion
