





Several have incompatible alterations


Slightly higher concentration in neighborhoods east of Highway 5

Historic McKinney Survey: Materials and Alterations

- + Wood is the most common exterior wall material
 - Brick second most common
- + Most roofing was composite shingles
- + Most common alteration was replacement windows

Preservation Priority Ratings: Definitions

- +High: outstanding examples of architectural style
- +**Medium:** good examples of common styles; potentially undergone moderate alterations
- **+Low:** historic age, but lack significance and/or integrity
- +Non-contributing: modern infill, vacant/undeveloped parcels, and parking lots




