### Our Roots Run Deep.



This Historic Building, nestled on the Square of McKinney, served the community as a farm implement store dating back as far as 1910 before becoming the home of Johnson Furniture Company.

With rapid development in Collin County & McKinney in the 1970's, many stores went from vacant to housing antique stores and malls.

In 1992, Bill and Diane Haight, longtime McKinney residents, acquired the Johnson Furniture building and converted it to the Antique Company Mall.

In 2013, three dealers partnered together and purchased the building and business from the Haights.

Today, there are very few antique malls, and by some definitions only one, the Antique Company Mall.









### It's Who We Are.



Owners are Dealers themselves.

Our Families are deeply rooted in the McKinney Community and Historical District.

The Antique Company Mall is 15,000sf in size.

ACM encompasses over 150 separate spaces for rent.

ACM is occupied by more than 115 independent entrepreneurs – over 90% of whom are women.

### It's Who They Are.

Dealers are carefully selected from applications submitted.

A waiting list exists.

- They buy their own inventory- unique antique and vintage goods.
- They price their own inventory.
- They merchandise the inventory within their booths.

#### Dealer agreements require:

- 80% of the merchandise to be 1980's or older and only allow 20% "other".
- No crafts goods are allowed.

Our dealers have jobs and families.

The ACM provides income, socialization, and their 'entrepreneurial itch' is satisfied.

#### A Place Like No Other....

Well known in antique circles far and wide, throughout Texas and surrounding states, the ACM is a **destination** in and of itself.

Active Social Media presence on FB, IG, & X with over 21K combined followers, in the US and International.

Daily social media posts with engagement and shares from Dealers as well as clientele.

Many Dealers have their own Social Media presence and participate in the promotion of the ACM.

The ACM hosts late-night events such as 'Sip and Shop', Girl's Night Out, Candlelight shopping, as well as other special occasion events.

ACM also joins the fun and festivities of all Main Street events serving as both participants and promoters.

ACM contributes approximately \$165,000 annually in sales tax revenue to the State, the City, MEDC and MCDC.

### Revitalization.

Since acquiring the ACM, owners have made improvements by keeping focus on current and future needs with each project undertaken.

- ✓ Interior plumbing and fixtures replaced.
- √ Removed hanging industrial gas heaters.
- ✓ New AC & heating systems. Added over 30 tons of AC.
- ✓ Upgraded the cashier station twice to be larger, more prominent and to provide for 3 stations.
- ✓ Changed to LED lighting throughout.
- ✓ Installed central sound system.
- ✓ Upgraded electric service and interior electrical wiring.

✓ Raised the mezzanine ceiling from a low of 5'4" to 6'10" now over 9'.

### Building Development Needs.

Upgrade Electric Service Panel

Request MCDC help cost \$23,000

This panel will provide electrical for the 15,000sf building for many years to come.

New Sewer Service

Request MCDC help cost \$16,500

This long-lasting sewer system will provide for the 15,000sf building and would enable the property to add restrooms and fixtures as needed. Currently there are two restrooms in the ACM.

Concrete Parking Lot

Request MCDC help cost \$40,950

This new lot will replace the weathered asphalt.

#### **Additional Projects include:**

- New glass installed across the entire front of the store. (Cost: \$40,000+)
- Construction & Installation of Awning. (Cost: \$20,000+)
