In June 2024, The Parks Church purchased the historic home located at the corner of Davis and Tennessee Streets in downtown McKinney. We acquired this property from a long-standing McKinney family with deep ties to the neighborhood. As a church committed to the flourishing of downtown McKinney, this home is an extension of that mission.

We deeply value the historical heritage of 110 E Davis Street. Our commitment to preserving this legacy is reflected in the extensive renovations we are undertaking. These improvements are not only cosmetic—they ensure that this important landmark remains a vibrant and enduring part of downtown McKinney's historical fabric.

This work aligns with our broader mission. For over 14 years, The Parks Church has faithfully served the east side of McKinney. Our efforts have included launching two significant downtown organizations: CommonGood Medical and the city's first weekly warm meal feeding ministry. CommonGood Medical is a primary care clinic serving uninsured and underserved neighbors, with more than 2,000 patient visits annually. Our feeding program, hosted at the Salvation Army, provides nearly 1,000 hot meals each month—meeting critical needs and creating community.

The Parks Church is not here to receive from the city, but to contribute meaningfully to it. Whether serving children, the unhoused, food-insecure families, or individuals facing loneliness, our church has consistently stepped into the hard places of McKinney with compassion and action to bring hope.

We also contribute significantly to the economic life of downtown. The Parks Church brings an average of **nearly** 5,000 people into downtown McKinney every month, directly benefiting local shops, restaurants, and businesses. In addition, we've helped launch and support several for-profit ventures on the square—businesses that enhance the vibrancy and sustainability of our downtown economy.

Our vision for the historic home on Davis Street is to use it as a hub from which we will continue to plan, serve, and build for the good of McKinney and our neighbors. With thoughtful renovation and a deep appreciation for its legacy, we are committed to preserving this home as a historical and missional jewel in the heart of the city.
