4B 25- 11	Heard Natural Science Museum	Upgrade four trails with Flex-Fine Base, a crushed rock and limestone powder variant that bonds to earth and creates a base layer that can withstand moisture, tolerate high levels of pedestrian traffic, and prevent the formation of holes and ruts on the surface. In addition, the outer loop trail will be upgraded to a poured concrete, 6' wide sidewalk making slopes and pedestrian passing more manageable. Switchback ramps will be added to the outer loop to more safely and easily ascend to landings and elevated spaces. Improvements will make outdoor exhibits and programs more accessible.	\$	211,160
