Robert "Bob" Tomes (1945-2024)

A Legacy of Service, Leadership, and Community

Early Life and Military Service

Robert "Bob" Tomes was born in San Antonio in 1945 and raised in Nebraska. He graduated from the University of Nebraska–Lincoln in 1968 and immediately enlisted in the U.S. Army. He served 18 months in the Vietnam War with the Military Assistance Command – Vietnam (MACV), where he earned a Bronze Star for meritorious service. He returned home in 1972 and was honorably discharged at the rank of Captain.

After leaving the Army, Tomes began a career with Ford Motor Company in Omaha, NE and later Houston, TX. In 1983 he and his wife, Barbara, took a leap of faith and moved to McKinney to open Bob Tomes Ford. He grew that enterprise into the Tomes Auto Group (which today includes Ford, Subaru, Volkswagen and Mitsubishi dealerships) and became known for blending business success with community stewardship.

Business Leadership and Community Stewardship

As a local businessman, Bob Tomes led by example. He saw McKinney's potential and embraced entrepreneurship, but he made clear from the start that his success would be from becoming a part of the community as "good stewards of McKinney." He proudly embraced his self-appointed nickname "Mr. McKinney," reflecting his intense interest in all community residents and his friendly, personal outreach.

Under his leadership, the Tomes Auto Group not only sold cars but also organized regular give-back campaigns. These initiatives included collecting over 106,000 diapers for the Baby Booties Diaper Bank, 10,000 pairs of socks for StreetSide Showers, 1,000+ pairs of shoes for the Children's Advocacy Center, new air-conditioning units for Meals on Wheels, 400 chickens to McKinney Roots, and constructing a bicycle barn at the Samaritan Inn. The family also established scholarship funds for local students and supported McKinney's growth through civic engagement.

Community Leadership and Civic Engagement

Bob Tomes held numerous volunteer and leadership roles in McKinney over the years. He was past President of the Rotary Club of McKinney, past Chairman of the McKinney Chamber of Commerce, and former Chairman of the United Way of Collin County. He also

served on the boards of the Volunteer McKinney Center, McKinney Way, and McKinney Economic Development Corporation. He supported McKinney Police & Firefighters Associations, was a lifetime member of the American Legion, and volunteered with the Boy Scouts of America, receiving the Silver Beaver Award for distinguished service.

In each of these roles, Bob brought the same energy and "people-first" approach he showed in business. He was frequently seen at community events, greeting neighbors with his signature firm handshake and genuine smile saying, "Top of the day to you!"

Philanthropic Support for Local Organizations

Beyond leadership positions, Bob Tomes personally championed a broad range of nonprofits and charities. Supported organizations included the McKinney Education Foundation, Samaritan Inn, ManeGait Therapeutic Riding Center, Boys & Girls Club of Collin County, Community Health Clinic of Collin County, Heritage Guild, Heard-Craig Center for the Arts, First United Methodist Church of McKinney, and the McKinney Chamber of Commerce.

In all these efforts, Tomes lived out his belief in being a good steward of his hometown by investing time and resources into people. By combining business success with structured philanthropy, he modeled civic responsibility for generations of North Texas businessmen.

Awards and Recognition

Robert "Bob" Tomes received numerous awards honoring his community leadership, including:

Each of these honors reflects a different facet of his impact: as a business leader, community builder, and steadfast volunteer.

Personal Character and Legacy

Friends and colleagues remember Bob Tomes as warm, generous, and endlessly positive. His nickname "Mr. McKinney" captured his enthusiasm for the city and its people. He never met a stranger and greeted everyone with genuine interest. After his passing, the outpouring of condolences confirmed his status in the community.

Bob Tomes was equally devoted to his family. He married Barbara in 1981 and together they raised their son, Brandon. In later years, he delighted in being a grandfather ("Bobo") to his three grandchildren. His legacy lives on through his family, the Tomes Auto Group, and the countless community projects he led.

Naming a public park in his honor would celebrate the values he embodied: servant leadership, generosity, and a warm welcome to every neighbor.
