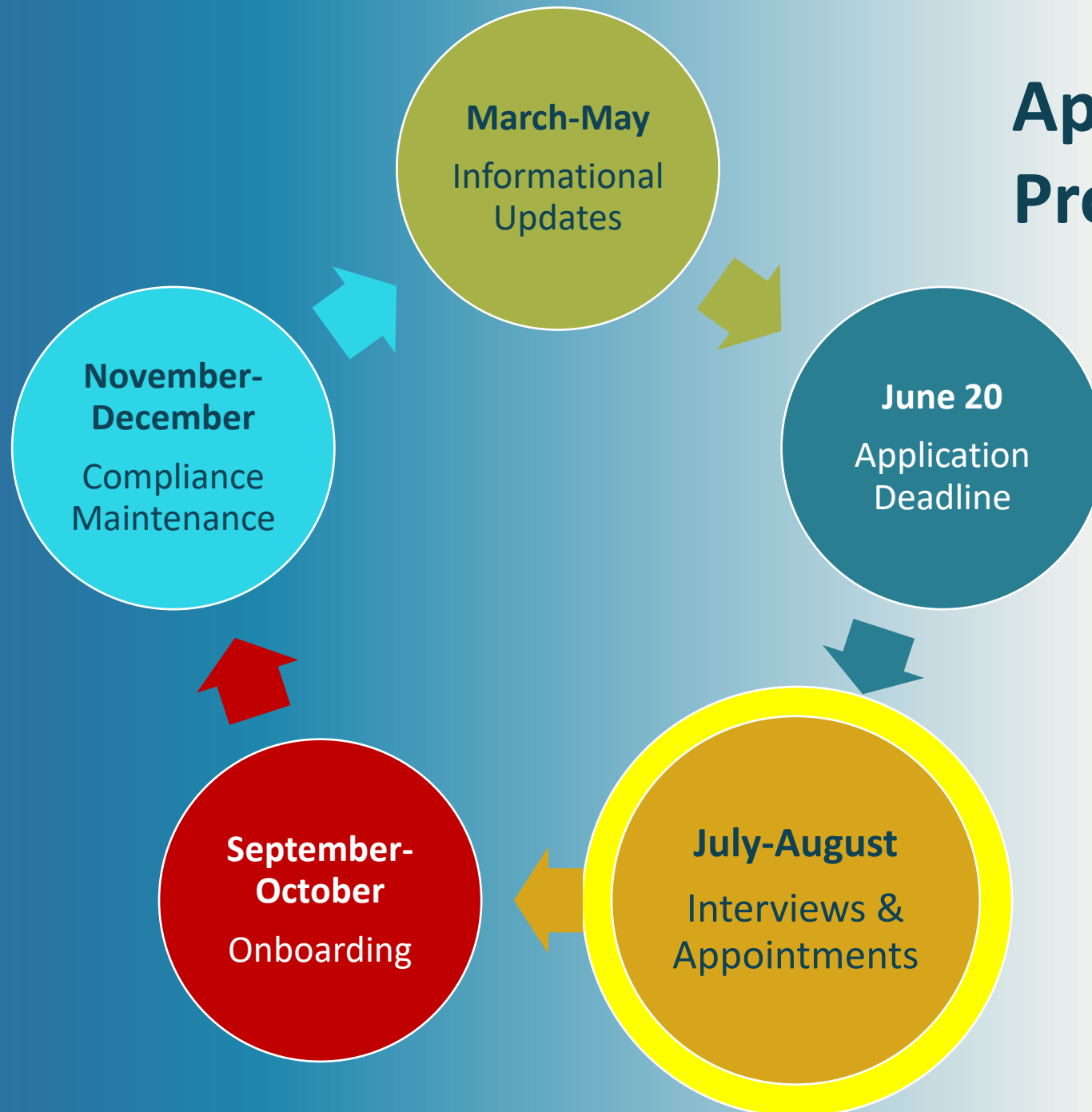

# Appointments Program Cycle



# Considerations

- **REGULAR Member** – active members, regularly engaging in meeting discussion and votes
- **ALTERNATE Member** – reserve status, serving in the absence of a regular member; term limits do not apply; subject to the same onboarding / training and meeting attendance requirements as Regular Members
- Service period for these appointments: October 1, 2025, to September 30, 2027, unless filling a partial vacancy.
- Maximum of **2** or **3** full consecutive full terms, depending on board. (*Policy Amended March 1, 2022*)

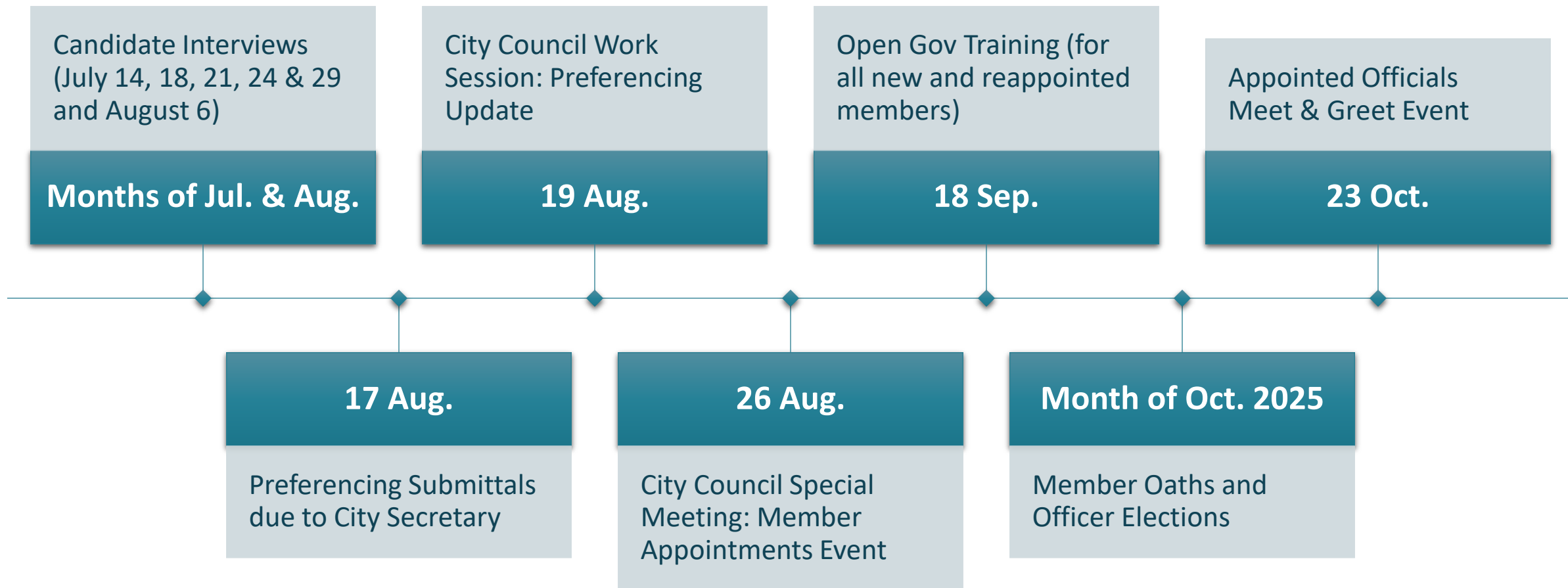

# Notable: Continuity Appointments

In 2024, long-serving members were reappointed for 1-year terms. The 2025 replacement appointees on these boards will also serve a 1-year expiring in 2026

- Animal Services Facility Advisory Committee
- Historic Preservation Advisory Board
- McKinney Community Development Corporation
- McKinney Economic Development Corporation

# Notable: Board Composition Updates

## **Historic Preservation Advisory Board – Certified Local Government Program**

- At least 60% (5 of 7 Regular members) must be in preservation-related professions as defined by the National Park Service
- Examples: Architecture, History, Planning, Archaeology, Folklore, Cultural Anthropology, Curation

## **Capital Improvements Advisory Committee – Texas SB 1883, amendment to Local Government Code Section 395.058(b)**

- The Capital Improvements Advisory Committee advises the City Council on matters related to the Impact Fee Program.
- Prohibits the Planning & Zoning Commission from serving as, or being, the Capital Improvements Advisory Committee
- Requires that not less than 50 percent of CIAC members to be representative of certain fields and not employees or officials of a political subdivision or governmental entity
- Requires at least one member appointed from the extraterritorial district (ETJ)

# Notable: Council Liaisons

- Assignments are updated annually by the Mayor
- City Council action is not required to approve assignments
- Formal Liaisons, per the boards & commissions policy
  - Housing Authority, Main Street, MCDC, MEDC, Parks & Rec, Planning & Zoning, Visit McKinney
- Liaisons are traditionally assigned to all boards
- Liaisons are not members of their assigned boards
- Liaisons attend board meetings and provide updates the City Council
