



New House Map

Total Bills Filed & Passed

- 8,344 Bills & Joint Resolutions Filed
 - Approx. 23% impacting cities (per Texas Municipal League*)
- 1,258 Bills Passed
 - Approx. 18% impacting cities*
 - 17% more than the 87th session



Property Tax Relief

- Senate Bill 2 & House Joint Resolution 2 (88th 2nd Special)
 - Over \$12 billion in state funding to reduce school property tax rates
 - \$100,000 homestead exemption for school property taxes (currently @ \$40K)
 - A 20% "circuit breaker" (i.e., appraisal cap) on appraised values for nonhomesteaded properties that are valued at <\$5 million
 - Creates newly elected positions on local appraisal boards
 - Savings on franchise tax for small business
 - Requires Approval via Constitutional Election in November



House Bill 2127

"Super" Preemption Bill

- Expressly preempts certain home rule city regulations, AND
- Potentially preempts other home rule city regulations in fields occupied by state statute in particular codes, depending on how courts rule, AND
- Creates a cause of action for lawsuits against a home rule city to determine whether a city regulation is preempted, BUT
- Requires three months' notice before a claimant may bring a lawsuit against a city.



House Bill 2127

- Which city regulations may be preempted by the bill?
 - Unless expressly authorized, a city ordinance that regulates conduct in a field of regulation that is occupied by a provision of one of the following codes is void and unenforceable:
 - Agriculture Code
 - Business & Commerce Code
 - Finance Code
 - Insurance Code
 - Labor Code
 - Natural Resources Code
 - Occupations Code
 - Property Code



Public Finance

House Bill 2071 – PFCs

- Requires PFC properties to be within the boundaries of the sponsoring jurisdiction.
- Imposes audit requirements.
- Requires renovations and low income set asides for PFC acquisitions.
- Effective immediately on passage (signed by Governor 6/18/2023).

Senate Bill 1999 – Unused Tax Rate Increment

- Adjusts increment calculations from a rate outlook to a dollar outlook.
- Maintains 3-year increment window.



Public Finance

- Senate Bill 543 –380 Agreements
 - Allows a municipality to transfer real property it owns to an entity as a part of a Chapter 380 agreement.
- Senate Bill 1340 380 Agreement Reporting
 - Expands municipality reporting requirements to the Texas Comptroller.
- House Bill 4082 Certificates of Obligations
 - Sport facilities, stadiums, civic centers, convention centers, coliseums, and hotels no longer allowable for CO's/TAN's.



Land Use

- Senate Bill 2038 ETJ
 - Release of an area from ETJ by petition or election
 - ETJ release provisions don't apply to an area:
 - Designated as industrial district
 - Subject to a strategic partnership agreement
 - Located within five miles of a military base
 - Voluntarily annexed into a city's ETJ if located in high growth county with population over 240,000.
 - Located in certain parts of San Antonio ETJ
 - Annexations after January 1, 2023 do not expand the ETJ unless would-be residents of the ETJ request inclusion
 - If an area is released from ETJ, any city/county interlocal agreements giving city authority to regulate subdivisions is terminated as to the area and county is granted authority



Land Use

- House Bill 3699 Platting
 - Platting review process changes, including:
 - Removing plans from 30-day shot clock
 - Allowing city to delegate plat review to staff
 - Allowing city submittal calendars
 - Requiring all plat application materials to be published
 - Prohibits a city or P&Z from requiring an analysis, study, document, agreement, or similar requirement to be included as part of a plat application, development permit, or subdivision of land if not explicitly allowed by state law



McKinney Specific Bills

House Bill 1 (General Appropriations Bill)

• \$5,000,000 for the purpose of funding a hangar facility project at the McKinney National Airport for use by the Department of Public Safety

House Bill 5012

 Relating to the authority of certain municipalities to use certain tax revenue for hotel and convention center projects and other qualified projects

Senate Bill 2598 *Vetoed*

• Relating to the creation of the Honey Creek Improvement District No. 1; providing authority to issue bonds; providing authority to impose assessments and fees
