

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-05-XXX (R)

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, OR DESIGNEE, TO APPLY FOR AN IMPLEMENTATION GRANT WITH SUPPLEMENTAL ACTION PLAN ACTIVITIES THROUGH THE FY2026 SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL (SS4A) FUNDING PROGRAM FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND ACCEPT FUNDING IF AWARDED

WHEREAS, the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Funding Program, administered by the U.S. Department of Transportation's Office of the Secretary, provides financial assistance, on a competitive basis, to cities for projects that prevent roadway fatalities and serious injuries.

WHEREAS, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act authorized and appropriated one billion dollars to carry out the FY2026 SS4A program, with no more than 15% awarded to a single state.

WHEREAS, the city has used previously awarded SS4A funding to develop its soon-to-be-finalized Safety Action Plan, which has been informed with broad stakeholder input and aims to improve safety for all road users.

WHEREAS, through the efforts of Safe Streets McKinney, McKinney is committed to a holistic transportation safety program to serve its diverse and growing community. City staff along with community partners will use a data-driven, systemic approach to develop an action plan that targets policies, programs, and projects. McKinney's goal is to reduce traffic deaths and serious injuries on McKinney's streets by half by 2035 and eliminate by 2050.

WHEREAS, the funding, if awarded, will be used for improvements along Eldorado Parkway for lighting, signal upgrades and sidewalk/ramp upgrades, before-and-after evaluations, Road Safety Audits for Eldorado Parkway, Virginia Parkway, and University Drive, updating the Safety Action Plan public crash dashboard, and a pedestrian tunnel mural case study.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCKINNEY, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas, hereby authorizes the execution of all necessary documents for the submittal of a grant application to the U.S. Department of Transportation under the Safe Streets and Roads for All Funding Program for \$6,436,320 with a 20% required local match of \$1,609,080 for a total project budget of \$8,045,400.

Section 2. The City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas, authorizes the City Manager, or designee, as the City's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter, or terminate necessary agreements to carry out the grant objectives described herein.

Section 3. The City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas, understands the City will be responsible for any cost overruns of the grant award.

Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately from and after the date of passage and is so resolved.
