MCKINNEY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

AUGUST 19, 2025

The McKinney Economic Development Corporation met in regular session in the City Hall Council Chambers, 401 E. Virginia Street, McKinney, Texas, on Tuesday, August 19, 2025, at 8:00 a.m.

Vice Chairman Kuehn called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m. after determining a quorum present.

Vice Chairman Kuehn called for Public Comments for items on the agenda and there were none.

25-3048 Vice Chairman Kuehn called for the Minutes of the McKinney Economic Development Corporation Meeting of July 15, 2025.

Board members unanimously approved the motion by Board member Williams, seconded by Board member Woodruff, to approve the Minutes of the McKinney Economic Development Corporation Meeting of July 15, 2025.

25-3049 Vice Chairman Kuehn called for Board and Liaison Updates.

<u>City of McKinney-</u> City Manager Paul Grimes announced the 89th Texas Legislature has convened its second special session as of last Friday. There are a number of items on the session, including a few that pertain to the City. Mr. Grimes announced the City has proposed a budget of +2.88%, no-new revenue rate plus 2.88%, a budget of about \$950 million dollars total budget, operating budget around \$231 million dollars. The required public input session will be on September 2nd, which will also be the budget adoption date. Mr. Grimes announced \$15 million dollars of Federal funding has been withdrawn under the Big Beautiful Bill. City Council will meet tonight to evaluate options and decide how to move forward. Mr. Grimes announced there will be a public open house with Engineering staff on August 27th at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers to discuss public infrastructure on Tennessee, Lamar, Hunt and Kentucky streets. This pertains to the redevelopment of the area around the old City Hall.

Community Development Corporation- MCDC President Cindy Schneible announced the MCDC Board approved several promotional grants at their Board meeting last month. One grant is for a new event, McKinney Rooted in Rhythm, and will be hosted at Tupps Brewery in October. This event was originally planned for last year but was rescheduled due to the weather. There are several public hearings next week, including two retail infrastructure grants. One is for horizontal infrastructure at a strip center on Highway 380 across from Raytheon, The Blue Olive restaurant. The second public hearing is for infrastructure work at the Cotton Mill. There is also a public hearing scheduled for an amended project, The Neighbor Hub, which the MCDC Board approved last year. Sanchez Charities has partnered with a number of nonprofits to expand the scope of that project. It will be a nonprofit resource center that houses multiple agencies that serve residents, with the intention of keeping residents out of homelessness. "Build your own Business Silos" finish out has begun on the Tupps campus, with completion not expected for a few months. Startup retail businesses have already leased five solos. Work is also continuing on Lelo's Coffee.

<u>Visit McKinney-</u> Visit McKinney Executive Director Aaron Werner announced Sarah Nolting joined Visit McKinney as their new Communications and Media Specialist. Sarah comes from the Town of Little Elm. Mr. Werner thanked MEDC Marketing & Social Media Manager Gajary for joining the interview panel. The sales and recruitment process for Visit McKinney is continuing with a sports-heavy trend. Visit McKinney is working additional pickleball events and working to secure World Cup room blocks. Mr. Werner announced the Pro Pickleball Association (PPA) Texas Open was a great success at the tennis courts. They are returning March 9th through March 15th, 2026. Mr. Werner noted Visit McKinney has been working with a new marketing agency for most of this fiscal year, determining how to showcase McKinney for the next fiscal year. There will be a photo and video shoot to update creative content for the 2026 fiscal year.

MEDC Committee Updates:

Real Estate Committee- Secretary/Treasurer Helsley announced the Real Estate Committee met and have items to discuss today in Executive Session.

<u>Finance Committee-</u> Vice Chairman Kuehn announced the Finance Committee did not meet.

Governance Committee- Vice Chairman Kuehn announced the Governance Committee did not meet.

<u>Innovation Fund Committee-</u> Board member Woodruff announced the Innovation Fund Committee did not meet.

<u>Marketing Committee-</u> Board member Williams announced the Marketing Committee did not meet.

Board Chairman- Vice Chairman Kuehn had no items to report.

25-3050 Vice Chairman Kuehn called for the MEDC Monthly Reports.

Project Funnel- SVP Talley announced Project Manager Troy Billett and

Business Intelligence Analyst Erick Rodriguez are working in Salesforce to help break out the project stages differently. Active projects are at 34, up drastically due to Project Manager Billett's work on the Innovation Fund pipeline. SVP Talley announced we have 145 applications, 23 of which are from Dallas Startup Week alone.

Marketing Report- MEDC Marketing & Social Media Manager Gajary announced we have created a workflow to capture articles on McKinney, summarize them, put them on the website, and create a log of recent articles published about everything good happening in McKinney. For MEDC, downtown, Visit McKinney, MCDC, etc. This will allow us to capture and capitalize on those articles. There is a new tab on the website if you want to see the article collection. Mr. Gajary announced the U-Haul one-way rental from other states to Texas has been a recurring marketing strategy for MEDC. There is an increase in southern states, such as Oklahoma and Florida, renting trucks and moving one-way to Texas. Mr. Gajary noted we may begin targeting the south with digital marketing.

Vice Chairman Kuehn called for Main Street Downtown Development Update and Strategic Objectives. President Kowski announced part of our mission is to spotlight and celebrate our partners doing great work alongside us. Director of Cultural District Andrew Jones and Downtown Development Manager Graham Meyers are here to talk about what is going on in downtown McKinney. Vice Chairman Kuehn called for the June 2025 Financials. Assistant Director of Finance Chance Miller announced with the state laws changing the agenda posting deadline, financials will be one month behind due to finance closing dates. Total revenue for the month of June was \$2.1 million. For expenditures, there were \$36,000 in operational

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expenses, \$15.1 million in project expenses (the transfer for the airport

project), and \$245,000 in non-departmental expenses. Sales tax

collected in June applies to April sales. There was a 2.2% increase,

bringing the year-to-date to 2.5%. Allen had a 3.3% increase, Frisco had

a 4.4% increase, and Plano had a slight decrease, likely due to audit

collections. McKinney had audit collections that hurt us as well. For sales

tax by industry, most months have been consistent, with retail trade at

5% and a strong indicator for how McKinney has performed this year.

Board members unanimously approved the motion by Secretary/Treasurer

Helsley, seconded by Board member Denissen, to approve the June 2025 Financials.

Vice Chairman Kuehn called for Public Comments for items not on the agenda

and there were none.

Vice Chairman Kuehn called for Board Comments and there were none.

Vice Chairman Kuehn recessed the meeting into Executive Session at 8:43 a.m.

Vice Chairman Kuehn reconvened the meeting into open session at 9:43 a.m.

Board members unanimously approved the motion by Secretary/Treasurer

Helsley, seconded by Board member Hamilton, to Adjourn.

Vice Chairman Kuehn adjourned the meeting at 9:43 a.m.






