WHAT IS A HISTORIC RESOURCES SURVEY?

Photo Documentation

Photographs historic resources from the public right of way

Inventory

Creates an inventory of historic properties, sites, & objects

Recommendations

Potential landmarks, districts, & preservation priorities

WHAT IS A HISTORIC RESOURCE?

According to the National Park Service a historic resource is:

"A constructed work ... consciously created to serve some human activity. Historic structures are usually immovable, although some have been relocated and others are mobile by design."

This may include:

- Buildings and structures
- Walls, fences, and stockades,
- Structure ruins
- Outdoor Sculpture
- Parks & landscapes
- Cemeteries
- Bridges, dams, and roads (and railroads)
- Nautical vessels and railroad stock
- Temple & burial mounds, Kivas
- Cemeteries




WHAT MAY BE A HISTORIC LANDMARK?

A building, structure, landscape, or object that is at least 50 years old AND

For this survey that means it was erected before 1975

Meets at least one of the below requirements:

- Is historically, architecturally, archeologically, or culturally significant
- Is associated with events that made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of local, regional, state, or national history;
- Is associated with the lives of persons significant in our past;
- Embodies the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction:
- Represents the work of a master designer, builder, or craftsman; or
- Represents an established and familiar visual feature of the city



WHY SURVEY HISTORIC PROPERTIES?

Building Inventory

Taking stock of the kinds of historic buildings we have in McKinney

Identify Significant Resources

And in turn, identify areas where redevelopment could be appropriate




Informed Policy Decisions

Anticipating redevelopment pressures, planning development around historic properties



 Unique or significant sites and objects such as murals, sculptures, etc.

- Of McKinney
- Of Potentially significant properties, sites, objects






