Registered 501(c)(3) non-profit organization with the State of Texas

The MPF recruits, trains, organizes and equips teams of volunteers to work on projects in the parks such as maintenance of hike and bike trails, building nature trails, upkeep of parks and open spaces, and adding amenities.

Volunteer Economic Impact

•Since 2017 = 4,000+ volunteer hours!

•The organization Independent Sector estimates that the value of **volunteer** time for 2022 was **\$29.95 per hour**

4,427 hrs x \$29.95 = <u>\$132,408.95 into McKinney Parks</u>

In 2022, The McKinney Parks Foundation reported 1,929 volunteer hours worked valued at \$55,053.66 according to the Independent Sector.

Why we need Polaris UTV

UTV will improve MPF's ability to maintain the current 4.2 trail miles that extends to over 1.5 miles from the closest parking area.

Two row side by side seating UTV is needed to transport volunteers to job sites

Requested UTV can maneuver through the wooded paths to deliver volunteers/equipment to work areas.

Requested UTV has enough seating to transport volunteers in the event of an emergency

Requested UTV includes a winch which is a critical tool for clearing fallen trees on tight trails.
