HUD Annual Action Plan: What is It?

- The City of McKinney receives federal funding allocations annually from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).
- The **Annual Action Plan** is a one-year component of the Consolidated Plan, that details McKinney's priorities for investing resources and addressing community needs for the next fiscal year. The plan identifies the federal funding sources of CDBG and HOME, that will be used to implement activities and strategies. The program year is October 1, 2025 September 30, 2026.
- The Consolidated Plan is 5-year Plan, designed to help local jurisdictions assess their affordable housing and community development needs and market conditions, and to make data-driven, place-based investment decisions. The planning process serves as the framework for a community-wide dialogue to identify housing and community development priorities that align and focus funding from HUD.

The Annual Action Plan: How it is Used

- The city's Annual Action Plan addresses the priority needs and specific goals identified and proposed in the Consolidated Plan.
- As a grantee, the City of McKinney reports to HUD and the public at the end of each program year on its accomplishments and progress toward Consolidated Plan goals within the annual document, known as in the CAPER (Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report).

Categories of Community Need

- 1. Housing (Home Rehabilitation of Existing Units, Rental Assistance, Production of New Units)
- 2. Homelessness (Emergency Rental Assistance, Shelter, Supportive Services, Rapid-Rehousing)
- 3. Special Needs Populations (includes Youth, Seniors, Persons with Disabilities)
- 4. Non-Housing Community
 Development
 (Public Services, Economic Development,
 Infrastructure)
