Background

- August 5, 2025 – Council approved the FY 2025-2026 Annual Action Plan
 - HUD approval received in September 2025
 - \$321,000 of CDBG funds (2019-2022)
 - \$40,000 to Community Lifeline Center
 - Included microenterprise, façade improvements, workforce development (job training/job creation), and small business support as eligible activities

- CDBG Financial Amendments:
 - Reallocate the remaining \$402,636.00 of approved grant funds for eligible uses
 - Reallocate the remaining \$8,417.10 of CDBG-CV funds to Wellness Center for Older Adults
- CDBG Program Amendments:
 - Expand the Housing Rehabilitation Program to include subrecipients
- CSG Financial Amendment:
 - Transfer the \$40,000 awarded to Community Lifeline Center to The Samaritan Inn

Proposed FY 2026-2027 Community Support Grant Amendment

- Add a Nonprofit Capacity Building program
 - Use of funds may include:
 - Leadership and Governance Development
 - Strategic Planning
 - Evaluation and Financial Capacity
 - Technology and Data Security
 - Collaborative Learning for Best Practices
 - Training and Education
 - Fund development and general administrative activities, not eligible
 - Up to \$75,000 available for one or more non-profits
