

CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING

JULY 7, 2026

The City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas met in regular session in the City Hall Council Chambers, located at 401 E. Virginia Street, McKinney, Texas, on Tuesday, July 7, 2026, at 6:00 p.m.

26-0639 Proclamation for Arturo Lopez Diaz

Family members of friends of Mr. Diaz stood with the Mayor Pro Tem for the presentation of the proclamation and photographs. The proclamation text reads as follows:

WHEREAS, Arturo Lopez Diaz was a long-time employee of McKinney Independent School District and of the City of McKinney, and was a beloved member of our community; and

WHEREAS, born on July 10, 1961, in Corpus Christi, Texas, Arturo was the ninth of eleven children of Juan & Amparo Lopez Diaz, and in 1962, the family relocated permanently to McKinney, Texas, which became his hometown and the place he would dedicate his life to serving; and

WHEREAS, Arturo graduated from McKinney High School in 1979, remaining one of the biggest fans of McKinney Lions football and the Dallas Cowboys; and

WHEREAS, on July 16, 1983, Arturo married the love of his life, Olga Salazar, in Robstown, Texas, and they were united for 42 years, becoming the parents of 3 daughters and 1 son, welcoming also twelve grandchildren, and one great-grandchild; and

WHEREAS, Arturo was the cornerstone of his family, and he treasured every opportunity to bring loved ones together - whether hosting a barbecue, gathering everyone for a spirited game of Lotería, preparing a big family breakfast, or cooking a large pot of menudo, his greatest joy came from spending time with those he loved; and

WHEREAS, known affectionately as Mr. Arthur, he served as a custodian at Finch Elementary and Malvern Elementary schools for 37 years, and Old Settler's Recreation Center for 26 years, often holding two full time jobs at

once, and was highly respected, easily the hardest working, and the most liked among coworkers, students and everyone he befriended; and

WHEREAS, through his years of service, he watched generations of McKinney children grow up, leaving a lasting impact on countless lives through his kindness, dedication, and warm spirit; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Arturo Lopez Diaz, passed from this life on June 11, 2026, only weeks shy of his 65th birthday, the many people who knew and loved him hold dear countless memories of joy, generosity, and service that embodied his truest character; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to express our deepest gratitude for the life and service of Arturo “Mr. Arthur” Lopez Diaz, cherishing the lasting impressions he made in our community.

Mayor Pro Tem Rick Franklin called for City Council and City Manager Comments.

Council members Michael Jones announced the recent grand opening of the new Hugs Café location, greenhouse and training facility, which trains and employs adults with disabilities; commended the recent Independence Day festivities within the city; announced his son made a select baseball team, his teen daughter earned her drivers permit, and his five year old daughter has started playing chess; and announced he and his wife recently celebrated their thirteenth wedding anniversary.

Council member Justin Beller commended Mayor Pro Tem Rick Franklin for successfully leading the City Council meetings; commended the recent Independence Day festivities within the city; and mentioned the cutting of trees near power lines is controlled by Oncor Electric and not the City of McKinney.

Council member Geré Feltus also expressed sadness for the loss of trees, noting the city makes efforts to preserve as many trees as possible; and commended the Independence Day festivities within the city.
