



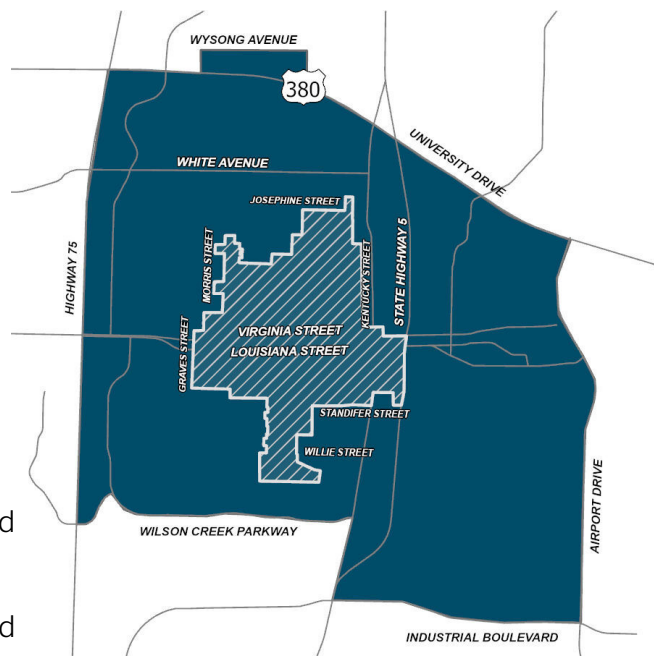
HISTORIC MCKINNEY SURVEY 23

UPDATE PLAN PRESERVE

The Historic McKinney Survey will provide recommendations to help guide future planning and development initiatives.

The survey area includes: (see map)

-  Completion of a historic resources survey to reevaluate and update surveys conducted in the 1980s and 2005
-  Identify, document, and prioritize previously undocumented resources within the survey boundary



What are Historic Resources?

Historic resources can be districts, sites, buildings, structures, and objects significant in American history, architecture, archeology, engineering, and culture.

About Historic Resources Survey:

- Uses a systematic method of documenting historic resources through fieldwork and research
- Documents each resource through photographs, maps, and a written description
- Identifies the value these resources provide to the community and future generations
- Offers recommendation of places to be preserved

Historic Resources Survey Goal:

- Facilitate future preservation projects such as delineation of local historic districts, architectural walking tours, and local or national nominations
- Gather information needed to plan for the wise use of a community's resources

Historic Resources Survey does not:

- Impose any restrictions or obligations on property owners
- Provide historic designation for any property
- Require access to the interior of any property
