**Narrative**

The residence at 611 West Virginia Street is believed to have been constructed circa 1898 as a modest, single-story, T-shaped frame dwelling. Updates and additions reflect the Folk Victorian architectural style common in late nineteenth-century North Texas. Characterized by simple massing, wood-frame construction, and restrained decorative detailing, the house represents a vernacular adaptation of Victorian forms widely used for middle-class housing during McKinney's early growth period.

Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps indicate that the structure was in its 1902 form and that, during its earliest years, the property likely functioned as rental housing rather than as a long-term owner-occupied residence. This pattern aligns with broader residential development trends in McKinney at the turn of the twentieth century, when houses near the town center were frequently held as income-producing properties (Sanborn Map Company, 1902).

During this early period, the property was associated with Dr. Scott Harrison Abbott, a prominent McKinney physician, businessman, and landholder. Abbott owned multiple parcels in the area and was actively involved in real estate transactions throughout Collin County. While there is no evidence that he resided at 611 West Virginia Street, deed records indicate his ownership prior to 1911, consistent with the house's apparent rental use during this period (Collin County Deed Records).

In 1911, the property was purchased by Wellington Charles "Will" Gerrish, marking a clear transition from rental use to long-term owner occupancy. Gerrish's acquisition represents the beginning of the most stable and historically significant period of ownership associated with the house.

Will Gerrish was a well-known McKinney businessman and civic leader. He was actively engaged in the grocery trade, including ownership and partnership in enterprises such as Barnes & Gerrish and later Gerrish & Fryer, with business locations along East Virginia Street. Contemporary newspaper accounts regularly reference Gerrish as a successful merchant and community figure (The Courier-Gazette, 1905–1908).

In addition to his commercial pursuits, Gerrish played an active role in civic life. He served as an officer of the McKinney Fire Department's Hook and Ladder Company No. 1 and participated in regional firemen's association activities. His frequent appearance in local newspaper coverage related to business, public service, and social events reflects his prominence within McKinney society (McKinney Weekly Democrat-Gazette, 1898; The Courier-Gazette, 1906–1921).

Will Gerrish married Linnie Mai Johnson Gerrish in 1908. Linnie Gerrish was a lifelong resident of Collin County and an active member of the First Methodist Church. She was widely known for her involvement in church work and local social organizations. Together, Will and Linnie Gerrish established 611 West Virginia Street as a permanent family home and a center of neighborhood social life.

Between approximately 1908 and 1914, the house underwent its most significant physical expansion. Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps from 1908 and 1914 document the addition of a second story and rear extensions, transforming the original T-shaped structure into a larger two-story residence consistent with its present footprint and massing (Sanborn Map Company, 1908; 1914). These alterations correspond with Gerrish's ownership and reflect the evolution of the property from a modest rental dwelling into a substantial Folk Victorian family residence.

The Gerrish's remained in residence at 611 West Virginia Street for more than three decades.

Linnie Mai Gerrish passed away at home in 1947 following a prolonged illness (The Courier-Gazette, January 6, 1947). Will Gerrish continued to reside in the home until he passed away at home in 1954.

Following Gerrish's death, the property was sold in 1955 to Joe and C. H. Sullivan.

Contemporary newspaper coverage documents the Sullivans' occupancy of the home shortly after purchase, including a public housewarming event held at the residence (The Courier-Gazette, October 15, 1955).

In the latter half of the twentieth century, the property changed hands several times, including ownership by Edsel and Doris Harris and later Dallas and Frances McCullough. In 1977, Maxey Sr. and Lillian Batson acquired the property and conveyed it within the same year to Michael and Melanie Trost (Collin County Public Records).

A new preservation phase began in 1979 when Tom and Barbara Swing purchased the residence and undertook a substantial rehabilitation. Newspaper features document interior reconfiguration, restoration of original wood floors, and sensitive modernization while preserving the home's historic character. Under the Swings' ownership, the house was featured on McKinney's Heritage Guild Holiday Tour of Homes in 1980 and described as an 1898 Victorian farmhouse (The Courier-Gazette, November 27–28, 1980; Bridwell, 1980).

In 1996, the property was purchased by William and Rosie Hughes, who invested extensively in further restoration, emphasizing period materials, original millwork, and turn-of-the-century design elements. The home again appeared on McKinney's Holiday Tour of Homes in 1998, with

newspaper coverage highlighting both interior and exterior preservation and reaffirming the home's late-nineteenth-century construction (The Courier-Gazette, November 22, 1998; December 4, 1998). William Hughes remained in the residence until his death in 2023.

As of 2024, the property at 611 West Virginia Street is owned by Morgan Newman and Jason Manske, continuing more than a century of documented residential use and preservation of one of McKinney's intact Folk Victorian homes.

Wellington “Will” Charles Gerrish

&

Linnie Mai (Johnson) Gerrish

Wellington “Will” Charles Gerrish and his wife, Linnie Mai (Johnson) Gerrish, resided at 611 West Virginia Street from 1911 until 1954, a period that represents the longest and most historically significant phase of occupancy for the property. Will Gerrish, born July 7, 1876, in Rolla, Missouri, was a prominent McKinney businessman whose career in the grocery trade spanned several decades. He owned and operated multiple grocery enterprises, including partnerships such as Barnes & Gerrish and Gerrish & Fryer, with store locations along East Virginia Street that served as important commercial anchors for the growing town. His business success positioned him as a well-known figure within McKinney’s mercantile community.

Beyond his commercial pursuits, Gerrish was deeply engaged in public and civic life. He served as an officer in McKinney’s Hook and Ladder Company No. 1 and participated in regional firemen’s associations, reflecting his commitment to public safety and volunteer service. He was also active in fraternal organizations, including the Masonic order, and regularly appeared in local newspaper accounts related to civic events, charitable efforts, and community gatherings.

Linnie Mai Gerrish, born August 8, 1876, in McKinney, Texas, was a lifelong resident of Collin County and an active member of the First Methodist Church. She was widely involved in church work, women’s groups, and local social organizations, contributing to the town’s religious and social life during the early twentieth century. Together, Will and Linnie Gerrish established their home at 611 West Virginia Street as a center of family life and neighborhood activity, hosting gatherings and maintaining strong social ties within the community.

The Gerrishes' long residence coincided with the most significant architectural development of the house. During their ownership, the residence was expanded into its present two-story form, reflecting both the family's growing prosperity and the evolution of the surrounding neighborhood. The home's transformation from a modest rental dwelling into a substantial Folk Victorian residence mirrors the broader maturation of McKinney during this period.

Linnie Mai Gerrish passed away at the home in 1947 after a prolonged illness. Will Gerrish continued to reside there until his death in 1954, marking the close of an era for the property. Both are buried at McKinney's historic Pecan Grove Cemetery. Their enduring presence at 611 West Virginia Street and their contributions to McKinney's commercial, civic, and social life firmly establish the Gerrishes as notable residents and the home as a tangible link to the city's early twentieth-century history.

- There was a carport on the West side over the driveway, removed between 1985 and 2005. Image Below.






