


MUNICIPAL COURT

McKinney is a Municipal Court of Record

Criminal Jurisdiction over "fine-only" misdemeanors, city ordinance violations, and certain administrative cases.





Court of Record July 2019

Expanded jurisdiction

Appeals process is self-limiting

Judge must be a licensed attorney



183 Courts of Record in Texas

Plano, Richardson, & McKinney are the only Collin County COR



Current fiscal year 10/1/22 - 7/31/23

10,769 new cases filed

12,578 cases disposed

791 warrants cleared

3,558 outstanding warrants (Compared with 14,833 in 2018)

1,001 purged cases




