Dear McKinney City Council and MCDC Board,

We are deeply thankful for your ongoing leadership and dedication in supporting this grassroots effort to help those in need and advancing our mission of providing accessible healthcare to those experiencing homelessness. Our heartfelt gratitude goes to the McKinney Community Development Corporation (MCDC) for recognizing the vision and importance of the Collin County NeighborHUB of McKinney (NeighborHUB)—a vital center created to promote advocacy, encourage collaboration, and provide respectful, dignified assistance to our most vulnerable neighbors.

McKinney has recognized the strength in working together to serve our community. A shared space where agencies can collaborate is more than practical: it's compassionate and thoughtful. As the city grows, so do the challenges, and without a central hub, those in crisis face a confusing, fragmented system while organizations stretch to meet rising costs. A unified center isn't just efficient—it will become a lifeline. Too often, our unhoused friends seeking help must tell their stories over and over, facing obstacles instead of open arms. NeighborHUB seeks to change that—bringing services together under one roof to provide care that is respectful, streamlined, and truly supportive.

To preface, the Dallas County homeless community is currently served by Parkland mobile health clinics that provide screenings, prescriptions, and other treatments. Collin County lacks such resources, although there are over 500 homeless individuals in Collin County and thousands more uninsured. As a result, emergency departments often act as the first line of health care for these individuals.

We began North Texas MedBridge to fill this large gap in health services for the unhoused, especially in Collin County. We provide health screenings that check blood pressure, blood sugar levels, Flu and Covid, and treat minor illnesses with over the counter medications. We collaborate with mental health, wound care, mobile mammogram units, STI testing units, EKG services, and more to provide screenings at our events. This reflects our objective of providing comprehensive, thoughtful care to those who lack access and awareness. Our long term goal is to be able to provide more **primary** medical care at the points of need and to be able to provide common prescription medications to homeless individuals in Collin County. Our partnership with the NeighborHUB will allow for an

even greater scope of services we can offer to our unhoused population through coordination with other partnering organizations.

### **Mission Statement:**

We believe that access to quality healthcare for the homeless is a fundamental right, and our mission is to *bridge* the gap for those who lack access to adequate medical resources. We strive to go directly to the <u>point of need</u>.

We have held several health screening events around Collin County since we formed North Texas MedBridge and have found that the need is greater than we originally thought.

In only one year, North Texas MedBridge has served over 240 patients in Dallas and Collin counties and has facilitated over 260 preventative screening services, including mammograms, PAP smears, STI tests, and mental health counsels.

In Collin County specifically, we successfully have had:

- 56 patients screened
- 23 free mammograms
- 8 free PAP smears
- 11 patients scheduled for free Mental health counseling
- 43 free haircuts

Of our Collin County patients, 23% have had what we classify as "New Health Risks," meaning that they had no previous official diagnosis of any chronic disease, yet had abnormal health screening results (blood pressure, blood sugar, oxygen saturation, mental health, etc). In addition, 34% of our patients are at "Severe Risk," a classification we determine by a combination of chronic disease status, access to medications, prescription status, and ER visits in the past 3 months. Most notably, the combination of chronic disease and having no access to medications had the largest weight in determining whether a patient was at "Severe Risk" or not, which is a gap North Texas MedBridge aims to help fill with its Street Medicine initiative.

To accomplish our mission, we need other organizations to come alongside our journey to provide basic healthcare to those in need. That's why we're inviting like-minded organizations to join us in our street medicine initiative—an effort grounded in compassion, dignity, and accessibility. Through partnering with NeighborHUB, we can build a unified network of care for McKinney's unhoused communities. We have the opportunity to coordinate services, share resources, and reach more people in need with greater efficiency.

With this partnership, our organization will be able to increase the number of health screening events that we hold and provide expanded care possibilities to homeless individuals in Collin County. We don't intend to stop there, as our vision is to grow into a fully equipped mobile healthcare unit to service McKinney, Collin County and beyond. With yours and NeighberHUB's impact, we can transform how healthcare is delivered to our most vulnerable neighbors and help in positioning McKinney at the forefront of integrated and innovative healthcare delivery.

# We will be able to provide:

- 1. Immediate medical care at the point of need within our scope, point-of-care testing (with partner organizations), mental health counseling, medications (antibiotics, Diabetes, high cholesterol, hypertension). We hope to keep our patients out of the ER and to encourage preventative medicine.
- 2. Direction, enabling patients to find a medical home for follow-up care with clinics such as:
  - a. Common Good Clinic McKinney
  - b. Community Health Clinic McKinney (Catholic Charities)
  - c. TruCare Clinic in Lewisville

d. Healthy Family Services of Texas

To address the gaps in care that we have observed in Collin County homeless populations, we believe that our combined efforts have brought us one step closer towards achieving equity. With the limited resources we have had, we have been able to develop creative solutions to deliver personalized care for the homeless. We welcome the opportunity to discuss our plans in more detail and explore how we might work together to improve healthcare access in our community.

We began North Texas MedBridge to fill this large gap in health services for the unhoused, especially in Collin County. We provide health screenings that check blood pressure, blood sugar levels, Flu and Covid, and treat minor illnesses with over the counter medications. We collaborate with mental health, wound care, mobile mammogram units, STI testing units, EKG services, and more to provide screenings at our events. This reflects our objective of providing comprehensive, thoughtful care to those who lack access and awareness. Our long term goal is to be able to provide more **primary medical care at the points of need** and to be able to provide common prescription medications to **homeless individuals in Collin County**. Our partnership with the NeighborHUB will allow for an

even greater scope of services we can offer to our unhoused population through coordination with other partnering organizations.

- 8 free PAP smears

Of our Collin County patients, 23% have had what we classify as "New Health Risks," meaning that they had no previous official diagnosis of any chronic disease, yet had abnormal health screening results (blood pressure, blood sugar, oxygen saturation, mental health, etc). In addition, 34% of our patients are at "Severe Risk," a classification we determine by a combination of chronic disease status, access to medications, prescription status, and ER visits in the past 3 months. Most notably, the combination of chronic disease and having no access to medications had the largest weight in determining whether a patient was at "Severe Risk" or not, which is a gap North Texas MedBridge aims to help fill with its Street Medicine initiative.

To accomplish our mission, we need other organizations to come alongside our journey to provide basic healthcare to those in need. Dear McKinney City Council and MCDC Board,

I hope this letter finds you well! Thank you for your continued service to McKinney, and especially to our friends and neighbors in need. The purpose of this letter is to enthusiastically request support for the NeighborHub concept. One Heart McKinney has served over 1,100 families in the past two years, resulting in 3,400 referrals to organizations that are part of the One Heart McKinney network as well as many organizations outside the network. We meet folks at some of the toughest points of their life. Operating in crisis mode is difficult for any family, and if we can help a family obtain the help they need even one day earlier, that is one less day a family is hungry, sick or suffering. Through the work of partner organizations, we have also helped 150 families in obtaining housing assistance.

One Heart McKinney has performed this work completely virtual. This has been a logical starting point, providing maximum access to our friends and neighbors in need, and helping to reduce barriers such as transportation and geography. In the normal course of our work, we have found a spirit of collaboration across the landscape of nonprofit providers who assist folks in McKinney, with a number of regularly planned events where nonprofit leaders meet and support each other. Such collaboration is a very good indicator of a healthy community of social service providers.

We view the creation of the Neighbor Hub as a logical and wonderful extension of the work we are already doing, and a proven way of enhancing collaborative activities. There are more than 300 nonprofit centers across the country, with varying missions, sizes, and tenants. In visiting with members of a national nonprofit center organization, as well as seeing examples of such centers in North Texas, it is clear the physical proximity of multiple social service accelerates access to the services available in such centers. For folks in crisis, time and travel requirements to access help are two of the primary enemies of crisis resolution.

Many centers have also been organized with the secondary goal of providing below market rental rates through arrangements that are reminiscent of what would be called Shared Services in the corporate world. The NeighborHub will handle common functions such as maintenance, physical upkeep, janitorial services, and provide common areas and equipment such as conference rooms and break rooms. This allows the nonprofits that will be a part of the NeighborHub to primarily focus on the social services they provide, without the responsibility and frankly the distraction of providing these items and other services necessary for day-to-day operations.



To further support both our fellow tenants in the NeighborHub and the friends and neighbors we will encounter there, One Heart McKinney will continue to expand our virtual network to provide streamlined access to needed services that exist beyond the Hub. We also view our ongoing work of collaborating with folks across the city to identify and lend any assistance we can to help solve existing social service gaps as a critical part of weaving the fabric of support for our friends in need. We feel these efforts will also help achieve what we feel is one of the responsibilities of all NeighborHub tenants, which is to recruit additional organizations and services to the NeighborHub.

Thank you for reading through this note, and just like our fellow tenants that plan to be a part of the NeighborHub community, we would be glad to answer any questions and visit at your convenience. I close with an adoption of a Hubert Humphrey quote about government as applied specifically to our city, "The moral test of a community is how it treats people in the dawn of life, the children; in the twilight of life, the aged; and in the shadows of life, the sick, the needy, the handicapped, and the struggling". I hope this letter finds you well! Thank you for your continued service to McKinney, and especially to our friends and neighbors in need. Operating in crisis mode is difficult for any family, and if we can help a family obtain the help they need even one day earlier, that is one less day a family is hungry, sick or suffering. Through the work of partner organizations, we have also helped 150 families in obtaining housing assistance.

This has been a logical starting point, providing maximum access to our friends and neighbors in need, and helping to reduce barriers such as transportation and geography. The NeighborHub will handle common functions such as maintenance, physical upkeep, janitorial services, and provide common areas and equipment such as conference rooms and break rooms. This allows the nonprofits that will be a part of the NeighborHub to primarily focus on the social services they provide, without the responsibility and frankly the distraction of providing these items and other services necessary for day-to-day operations.

Being located at 2000 W. White Ave gives us a front-row opportunity to serve a wide range of neighbors beyond their spiritual and relational needs. We get the occasional "frequence flyer" who knows all the circles of churches that don't talk to one another and duplicate services again and again. We also get neighbors really in need of intervention and advocacy. When we have exhausted our ideas and offerings, we are left with (often outdated) lists for people to call, tell their story again and again (which is re-traumatizing and causes even more psychological harm) until they might find something helpful.

### BUT WHAT IF WE COULD COLLABORATE OUR RESOURCES AND PEOPLE ONLY TOLD THEIR STORY ONCE? The HUB, for Grace House Community Church, represents just that kind of option.

This centralized service opportunity would allow our neighbors to tell their story ONCE and then those of us on the service provider side can collaborate and coordinate for wrap around care- physically, emotionally, mentally, relationally, financially and spiritually. Holistic care that will offer a help up with hope and next steps to reach sustained healing and wholeness.

As a church, we are eager to do our part in helping all people flourish. We simply can't do it all and frankly don't have to. We have the opportunity right now to partner with you, MCDC, and other churches, non-profits and community leaders to offer wrap-around care that is more efficient, respectful and effective. This not only allows people to receive the best, most dignified and most thorough care we have to offer, it also allows our benevolence dollars to go further as we collaborate before we create.

Dear McKinney City Council and MCDC Board,

We are deeply thankful for your ongoing leadership and dedication in supporting this grassroots effort to help those in need and advancing our mission of providing accessible healthcare to those experiencing homelessness. Our heartfelt gratitude goes to the McKinney Community Development Corporation (MCDC) for recognizing the vision and importance of the Collin County NeighborHUB of McKinney (NeighborHUB)—a vital center created to promote advocacy, encourage collaboration, and provide respectful, dignified assistance to our most vulnerable neighbors.

McKinney has recognized the strength in working together to serve our community. A shared space where agencies can collaborate is more than practical: it's compassionate and thoughtful. As the city grows, so do the challenges, and without a central hub, those in crisis face a confusing, fragmented system while organizations stretch to meet rising costs. A unified center isn't just efficient—it will become a lifeline. Too often, our unhoused friends seeking help must tell their stories over and over, facing obstacles instead of open arms. NeighborHUB seeks to change that—bringing services together under one roof to provide care that is respectful, streamlined, and truly supportive.

To preface, the Dallas County homeless community is currently served by Parkland mobile health clinics that provide screenings, prescriptions, and other treatments. **Collin County lacks such resources**, although there are over 500 homeless individuals in Collin County and thousands more uninsured. As a result, emergency departments often act as the first line of health care for these individuals.

We began North Texas MedBridge to fill this large gap in health services for the unhoused, especially in Collin County. We provide health screenings that check blood pressure, blood sugar levels, Flu and Covid, and treat minor illnesses with over the counter medications. We collaborate with mental health, wound care, mobile mammogram units, STI testing units, EKG services, and more to provide screenings at our events. This reflects our objective of providing comprehensive, thoughtful care to those who lack access and awareness. Our long term goal is to be able to provide more <u>primary medical care at the points of need</u> and to be able to provide common prescription medications to <u>homeless individuals in Collin County</u>. Our partnership with the NeighborHUB will allow for an

even greater scope of services we can offer to our unhoused population through coordination with other partnering organizations.

#### **Mission Statement:**

We believe that access to quality healthcare for the homeless is a fundamental right, and our mission is to *bridge* the gap for those who lack access to adequate medical resources. We strive to go directly to the <u>point of need</u>.

We have held several health screening events around Collin County since we formed North Texas MedBridge and have found that the need is greater than we originally thought.

In only one year, North Texas MedBridge has served over 240 patients in Dallas and Collin counties and has facilitated over 260 preventative screening services, including mammograms, PAP smears, STI tests, and mental health counsels.

#### In Collin County specifically, we successfully have had:

- 56 patients screened
- 23 free mammograms
- 8 free PAP smears
- 11 patients scheduled for free Mental health counseling
- 43 free haircuts

Of our Collin County patients, 23% have had what we classify as "New Health Risks," meaning that they had no previous official diagnosis of any chronic disease, yet had abnormal health screening results (blood pressure, blood sugar, oxygen saturation, mental health, etc). In addition, 34% of our patients are at "Severe Risk," a classification we determine by a combination of chronic disease status, access to medications, prescription status, and ER visits in the past 3 months. Most notably, the combination of chronic disease and having no access to medications had the largest weight in determining whether a patient was at "Severe Risk" or not, which is a gap North Texas MedBridge aims to help fill with its Street Medicine initiative.

To accomplish our mission, we need other organizations to come alongside our journey to provide basic healthcare to those in need. That's why we're inviting like-minded organizations to join us in our street medicine initiative—an effort grounded in compassion, dignity, and accessibility. Through partnering with NeighborHUB, we can build a unified network of care for McKinney's unhoused communities. We have the opportunity to coordinate services, share resources, and reach more people in need with greater efficiency.

With this partnership, our organization will be able to increase the number of health screening events that we hold and provide expanded care possibilities to homeless individuals in Collin County. We don't intend to stop there, as our vision is to grow into a fully equipped mobile healthcare unit to service McKinney, Collin County and beyond. With yours and NeighberHUB's impact, we can transform how healthcare is delivered to our most vulnerable neighbors and help in positioning McKinney at the forefront of integrated and innovative healthcare delivery.

#### We will be able to provide:

- 1. Immediate medical care at the point of need within our scope, point-of-care testing (with partner organizations), mental health counseling, medications (antibiotics, Diabetes, high cholesterol, hypertension). We hope to keep our patients out of the ER and to encourage preventative medicine.
- 2. Direction, enabling patients to find a medical home for follow-up care with clinics such as:
  - a. Common Good Clinic McKinney
  - b. Community Health Clinic McKinney (Catholic Charities)
  - c. TruCare Clinic in Lewisville
  - d. Healthy Family Services of Texas

To address the gaps in care that we have observed in Collin County homeless populations, we believe that our combined efforts have brought us one step closer towards achieving equity. With the limited resources we have had, we have been able to develop creative solutions to deliver personalized care for the homeless. We welcome the opportunity to discuss our plans in more detail and explore how we might work together to improve healthcare access in our community.

I've been serving as a priest in McKinney for nearly twelve years at St. Andrew's, a church deeply committed to serving our local community. Our members have started and led Believe!, Hugs Cafe, the McKinney Little Free Pantry, and C.L.I.M.B., and we've spent countless hours volunteering at the other wonderful organizations that serve our city. This has brought me in touch with many of the dynamic and dedicated leaders that serve those most in need in our community.
