

### **Dallas and Collin Counties**







- Patrol units are in contact with approximately 100 homeless individuals per month



## Fiscal Year 2024-25 Highlights: City Departments

### **HCD – Community Services**

- 8 households provided security deposit assistance
- 13 households provided emergency homeless prevention assistance
- CDBG assistance to unsheltered and atrisk individuals

### **HCD** – **Housing Services**

- 26 individuals provided with Tenant Based Rental Assistance
- 13 households served through the Housing Rehabilitation Program and Property Maintenance Program

#### **HCD – Transit Services**

• 54 Samaritan Inn Residents provided free transit services

### **Police Department**

- 1,064 calls regarding homeless
- \* numbers may be 30% higher than reported

### Fire Department

- 290 EMS Transports
- \*does not include 911 incidents

### **Code Services**

 30 documented cases were addressed

## **Public Works and Park Maintenance**

• 13 large cleanups conducted



## Fiscal Year 2024-25 Highlights: Service Providers

#### Samaritan Inn

- Shelter, clothing, meals, career coaching, access to medical and mental health resources, case management counseling
- •553 individuals provided shelter
- 76 households diverted from homelessness

## Family Promise of Collin County

- Case management, emergency shelter, financial literacy, rental/utility assistance, workforce readiness
- •9 families and 23 children served

### Wellness Center for Older Adults

- Caregiving counseling, information services, preventive healthcare, short-term transportation, street outreach
- •108 unique individuals served

# Texas Health Community Resource Center

- •Enhanced access to health care for uninsured or underinsured individuals
- •Over 60 individuals were served

### **Family Gateway**

- Assessment, diversion, emergency shelter, supportive housing, case management, education
- •37 McKinney residents were served
- •35 Mckinney residents were exited from homelessness


## All Community Outreach



- First McKinney Baptist Church (1615 W. Louisiana Street)
  - Availability: Starting November 5<sup>th</sup> (unavailable Fridays and Saturdays; and other select dates)
  - Capacity: Maximum 40 guests
  - Operations: Generally, 7:00 pm to 8:00 am
  - Temperature drops below 32 degrees F
