2018/19 Season Narrative Summary

The 2018/19 Season, for Youth Ballet of Texas, has been a season of exciting opportunity for growth. We reached out into new areas, growing our profile through radio interviews and marketing opportunities that came our way. We added much needed equipment, with a generous grant from the McKinney Arts Commission, in the form of new, portable flooring for performances. And we reached deeper into the classical ballet repertoire to give our dancers and audiences a taste of the famous Ballet Russes style of ballet in the production of *Firebird*.

Our goals for the 2018/19 Season were:

- To maintain or surpass the quality and professionalism of our performances.
- To provide low-income students access to the many benefits of classical ballet training through scholarships.
- To provide support for our 'Boys in Ballet' program that seeks to erase stereotypes and support young men who are interested in pursuing the art of ballet.
- To reach out to related non-profits serving the community in complimentary art endeavors for collaboration opportunities.
- To collaborate with non-profits working with under-served populations to provide free access to performances and/or training,
- To provide entertainment at public events free of charge.

Throughout our season we sought to uphold the goals of the Arts Commission, programming a richly diverse season, danced by a diverse group of dedicated young artists. We worked with young choreographers, performed in multiple venues, and saw budding new talent both in the dance and choreographic fields.

August 2018 -

Adjustments in our programming were made to best showcase the talents and abilities of the dancers. This afforded us with an interesting opportunity to explore more diverse ballet repertoire, and resulted in a richly rewarding, and educational experience for the students.

September 2018 -

Our scholarship recipients this year began with 5 girls on need-based scholarships and 8 participants in the Boys in Ballet program.

YBT raised \$2707 through a Popcorn Fundraiser, a \$492 increase over last year's earnings. North Texas Giving Day earned us a total of \$596.

October/November 2018 -

Company members raise \$1,183 in program ads from local merchants. Private Donation received for \$1000.

November 30, 2018 - *Krakatuk: A Nutcracker Prequel* was performed at its original venue, the McKinney Performing Arts Center, for an audience of 200, including 30 free tickets for Embrace Texas.

Our Home for the Holidays performance and Living Window were attended by approximately 325 people.

We were sought out by KERA to give a short interview about our *Krakatuk: A Nutcracker Prequel* production.

December 2018 -

December 15, 2018 - Krakatuk: A Nutcracker Prequel was performed at the Eisemann Centre to an audience of 340.

January 2019 -

New Marley flooring is purchased with the Grant from McKinney Arts Commission. Rehearsals began for both *Alice in Wonderland* and *Firebird* performances.

February/March 2019 -

Rehearsals continue for Alice, Firebird, and Dance....Planet
March 16, 17, 2019 - Ballet Magnificat! Alpha Tour Workshop open to all dancers.

April 2019 -

April 7, 2019 - YBT dancers appear onstage at the Dance for the Planet festival at Booker T. Washington High School for the Performing and Visual Arts to an audience of 150.

Three new students joined the Boys in Ballet male scholarship program.

May 2019 -

May 11, 2019 - Alice in Wonderland and Firebird performed at McKinney North High School for an audience of 127. The firs performance on the new Marley flooring.

May 12, 2019 - Alice in Wonderland and Firebird performed at McKinney North High School for an audience of 96.

May 25, 2019 - Company Auditions at TYBC. 24 students accepted into the YBT company, including four female scholarship students and 2 male scholarship students.

June 2019 -

June 1, 2019 - Spring Potpourri performed in collaboration with Texas Youth Ballet Conservatory with original choreography by 6 of our YBT company members. Performed for an audience of 234.

Total attendance at all events - 1472

Approximately 200 people joined us in working on our productions this year. We worked to keep our expenses low, and our donations were able to cover the added expenses of the performances. We were happy to be back in McKinney on the new flooring for our Spring

performance. In kind donations of time, rehearsal space and supplies helped make the performances possible and provided the scenery for our beautiful productions.

Youth Ballet of Texas company members were successful at cultivating relationships with local businesses through our program ads, and many of the ads this year were from repeat customers renewing their ad space. Our audience members continue to be enthusiastic in their praise of our beautiful, fully-produced performances and the growing skills of our dancers.
