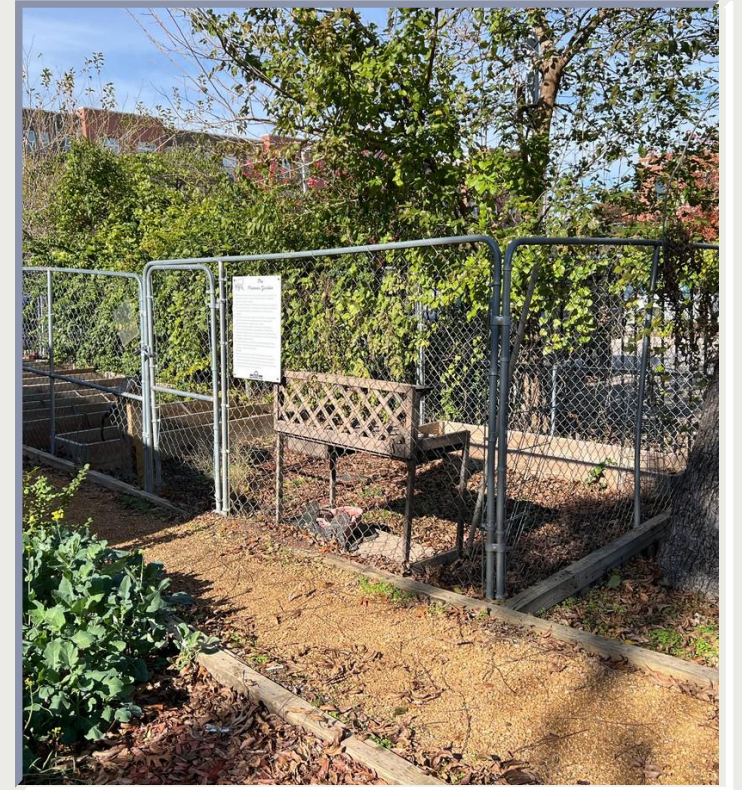

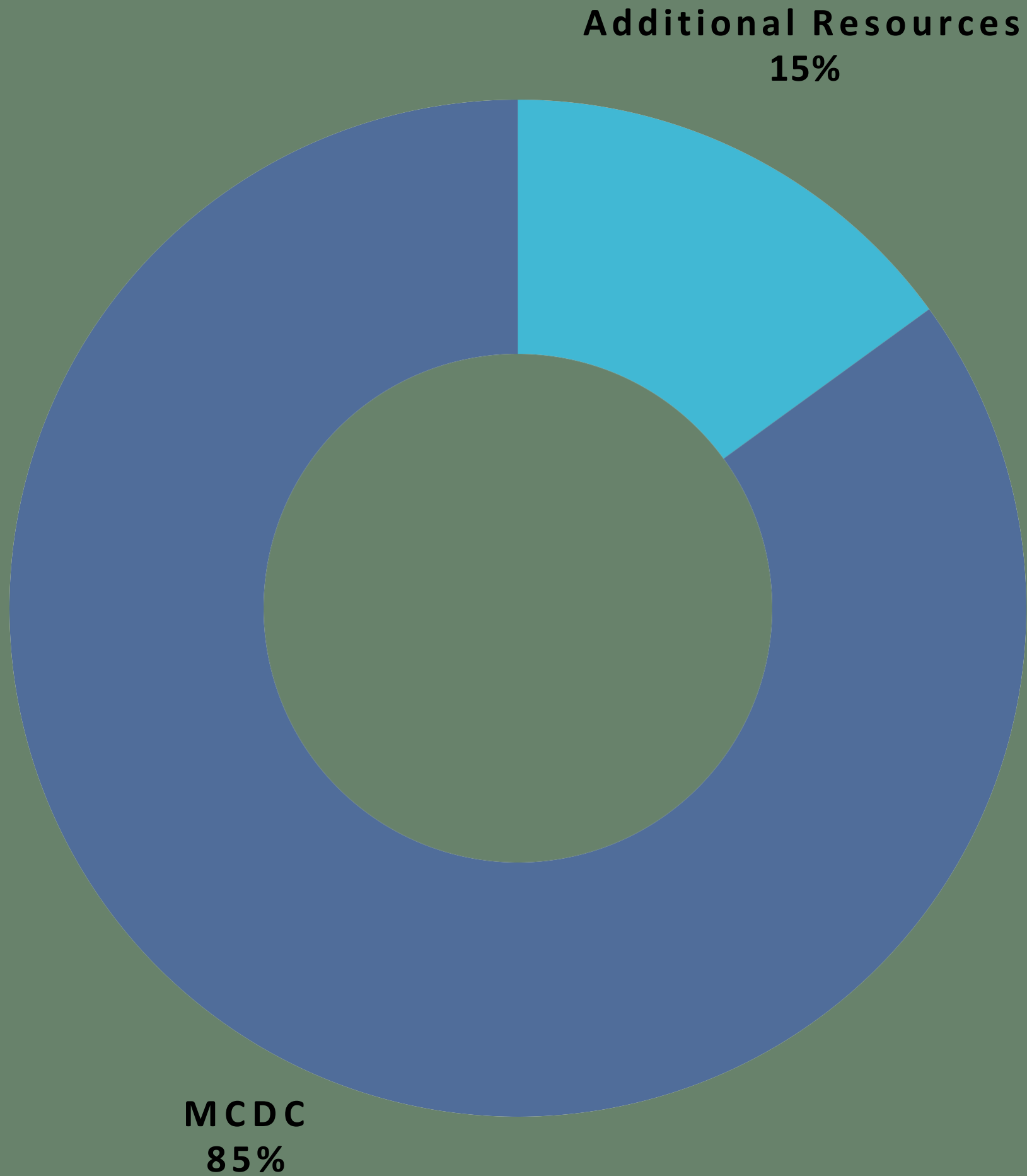

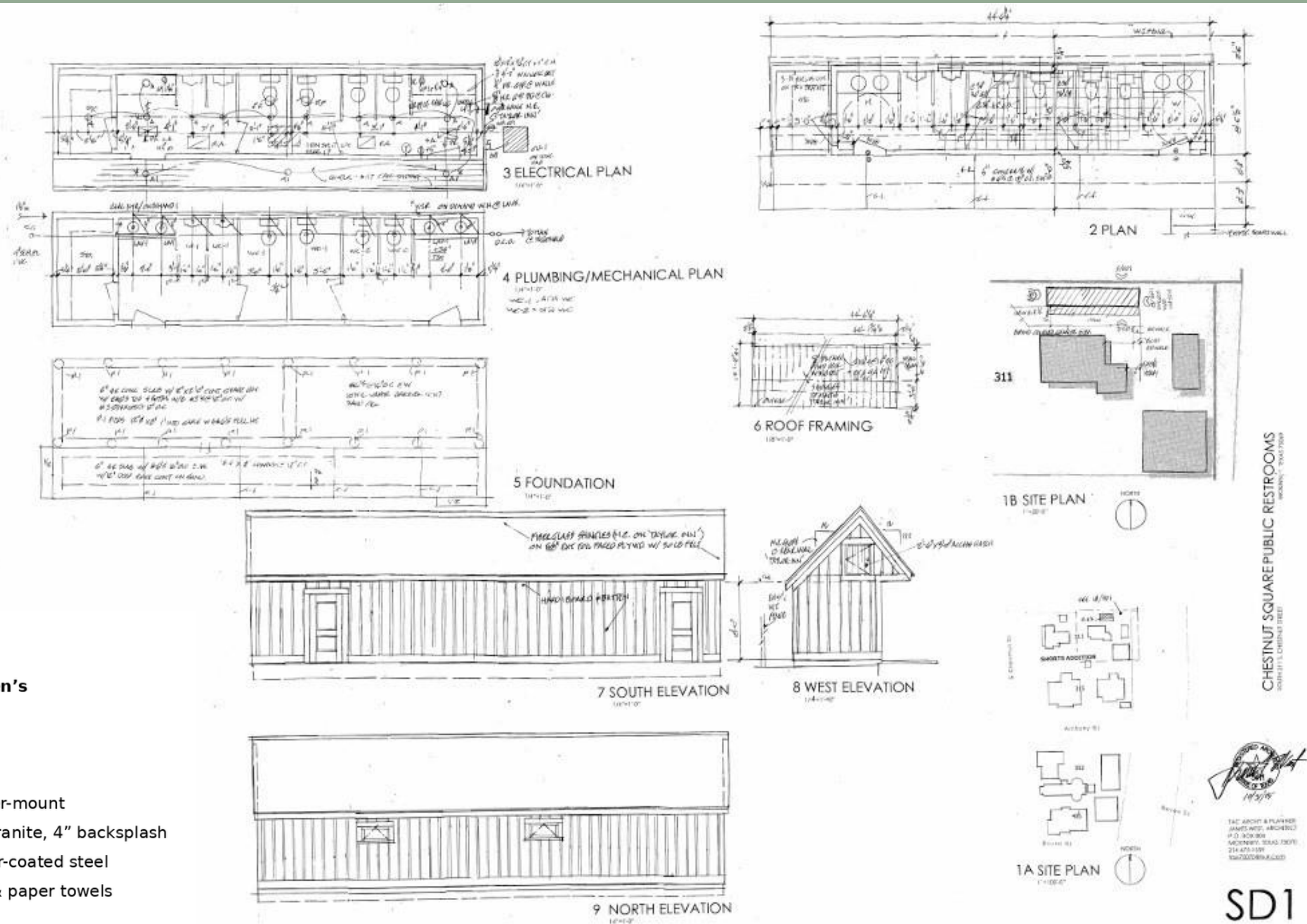
Site Plan: Taylor Inn Inspiration

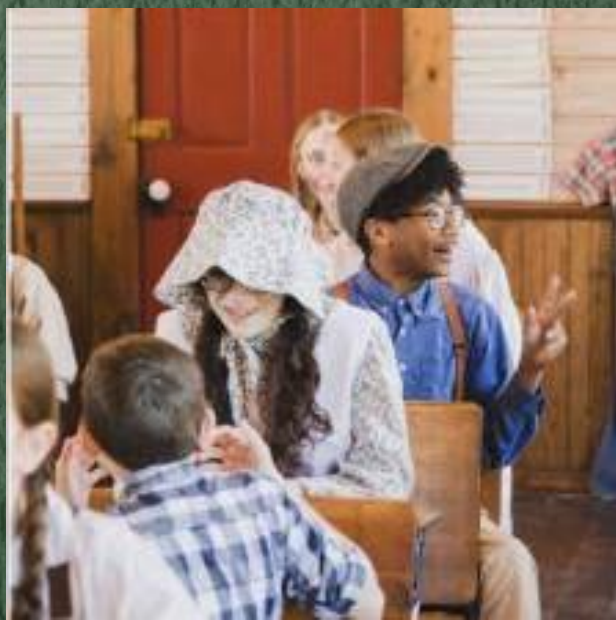
