NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON REALIGNING COUNCILMEMBER DISTRICTS

According to the 2020 Census data, the City's councilmember districts are not of sufficiently equal population and must be redrawn in order to comply with the "one-person, one-vote" (equal population) principle established by the U.S. Constitution.

In addition you need to be aware that the City Council has adopted Guidelines for public participation. The Guidelines, among other things, require that comments be submitted in writing even if you make them orally at the hearing; all written comments are due by the close of the hearing. The Guidelines may be found on the <u>City's Website</u>. Any plans that are proposed must conform to the redistricting Criteria adopted by the City Council. The Criteria are found under <u>City Resolution NO</u>. 2021-11-158 (R).
