The Garden Show 2023 was held the weekend of March 18-19, 2023 at Myers Park & Event Center in McKinney and involved 4 sponsors, 7 in-kind sponsors, 53 vendors, 1 charity partner, 6 cities and 10 non-profits as well as Hugs Cafe. This event generated \$26,976.22 in revenue and \$19,835.25 in expenses.

The Garden Show 2023 was held the weekend of March 18-19, 2023 and involved four sponsors, seven in-kind sponsors, 53 vendors, one charity partner, six cities, and ten non-profits, as well as Hugs Cafe. The Show Barn at beautiful Myers Park & Event Center in McKinney was home to the event and welcomed about 6,000 visitors over a two-day period.

Our 2023 charity partner, Community Garden Kitchen collected \$5,855 in donations over the course of the two-day event.

During the event, visitors experienced activities designed to suit a wide audience including:

- · A children's scavenger hunt
- An adult scavenger hunt
- Educational presentations by top regional horticulture experts
- Water conservation demonstrations
- Information booths staffed by trained Master Gardeners
- A marketplace of vendors providing horticulture-related products and services

Attendance seemed to be equally distributed between Saturday and Sunday but a bit lower than we anticipated after the Show's return in 2022 after a 2 year pause caused by Covid. We believe this to be due to the much colder than normal temperatures we experienced throughout the weekend. Sunday attendance was possibly affected by Texas teams playing in the NCAA Basketball Tournament.
