

We are an 80,000 square foot facility with world-class amenities, including an indoor competition pool, indoor and outdoor leisure pools, a supervised play area, and party rooms that are ideal for special occasions. Our multi-floor fitness hub features top-tier equipment catering to all fitness levels, along with our multiple fitness and cardio studio rooms, a dry sauna, gymnasium, basketball courts, and a 1/8 mi track!

Our Members

The facility opened in 2017. By October 2018, we had grown to a little over 5,000 active households in our database. Today, we sit between 5,800-6,000 households which equates to a little over 16,000 individual members.



Current Membership Data


- ▶ 89% are residents
- ▶ 61% of memberships are monthly
- ▶ 64% are family memberships
- ▶ We average 1,000 day pass users per month
- ► We average 40,000 member visits per month in the off season (September-May).
- ▶ During the months of May-August, we add an additional 800-1000 new households to our membership base. This takes us to over 18,000 members in the summer.

- Our ability to generate enough revenue to cover the ever-increasing expenditures is becoming flat due to space limitations and the ability to grow our programs.




Annual Membership* (One-time Payment - Paid in Full)
