 request.)
- Once eligibility for consideration is confirmed, Applicants will be notified and placed on the meeting agenda to make a presentation to the Board. Following the presentation, Board member will have an opportunity to ask questions of the applicant. Please note: This is a formal presentation and time limits may be imposed.
- A public hearing, with notice of application and request for funding, will be published and posted in accordance with the requirements of the Open Meetings Act and the Texas Local Government Code.
 The application, along with all documents/attachments will become public information once submitted to MCDC.
- Following the public hearing, grant requests will be referred to a subcommittee of the MCDC board for evaluation and recommendation of approval or denial to the full board.
- Board action on the grant application will be scheduled for the board meeting the month following the public hearing.

Established in 2017, the McKinney Parks Foundation (MPF) is dedicated to enhancing McKinney parks and natural areas through community involvement, environmental stewardship and education. The MPF focuses on three primary objectives:

Organizing volunteer efforts to support projects in collaboration with the McKinney Parks and Recreation Department.

Encouraging community engagement by promoting participation in parks activities and programs. Providing educational opportunities to increase awareness and understanding of the natural environment, especially the unique ecology of North Texas.

The MPF coordinates volunteer teams to work on a wide range of initiatives, including trail maintenance and construction, park and open spaces upkeep, and the addition of amenities to enhance the accessibility and enjoyment for all users. 





Executive Summary

Enhancing Trail and Greenspace Maintenance Across McKinney

The City of McKinney, Texas, is celebrated for its vibrant network of parks, nature trails, and green spaces, which provide recreational opportunities and enhance the quality of life for residents and visitors. With over 3,000 acres of public parkland, including Erwin Park, Bonnie Wenk Park, Towne Lake Park, Gray Branch Parkland, and the expansive natural areas surrounding Wilson Creek, maintaining these vital assets requires significant resources and effort.

Erwin Park exemplifies the challenges of managing McKinney's park system. Spanning 212 acres, it boasts over 10 miles of multi-use trails weaving through wooded terrain, open fields, and creek crossings, attracting thousands of hikers, bikers, joggers, and nature enthusiasts each year. The Polaris Sportsman X2 570 would enable volunteers to work more efficiently, extending their reach and minimizing physical strain. Its compact size, powerful hauling capacity, and ability to navigate narrow trails and rugged terrain make it indispensable for maintaining McKinney's parks.

The need for an ATV is distinct from the other equipment currently used by the McKinney Parks Foundation (MPF) due to its ability to navigate the diverse terrain and narrow trails commonly encountered at park spaces including Erwin Park. The advanced features and innovative design of the Polaris Sportsman X2 570 provide a tailored solution to the park's unique maintenance challenges, from rugged wooded areas to confined creek crossings. Moreover, the ATV's versatility extends beyond Erwin Park, offering potential utility in enhancing maintenance efforts at other parks within the City of McKinney. This investment ensures a broad and sustainable impact across the city's green spaces, aligning with MPF's mission to preserve and improve natural environments for community enjoyment.

A Model for Addressing Citywide Needs

The McKinney Parks Foundation (MPF) has taken on an expanding role in supporting the maintenance and volunteer efforts at Erwin Park, a critical recreational space in McKinney. Our strong partnership with the Dallas Off-Road Bicycle Association (DORBA) allows us to complement their dedicated work while enhancing and, at times, surpassing the scope of their volunteer efforts. While DORBA's focus extends to the construction and maintenance of mountain bike trails across the broader Dallas-Fort Worth area, MPF concentrates on the stewardship of whole park environments and trails within the City of McKinney. This alignment of missions creates a synergistic partnership at Erwin Park, where the combined efforts of both organizations ensure the park's trails and facilities meet the diverse needs of hikers, joggers, and mountain bikers alike.



The challenges at Erwin Park reflect those faced by other parks in McKinney. With its mix of open fields, dense woods, and creek crossings, Erwin Park's maintenance needs are diverse and complex. Volunteers frequently encounter steep slopes and narrow passages that are difficult to access with existing equipment.

For example, the ATV's 400-lb dump box and 1,350-lb towing capacity would enable volunteers to quickly deliver materials to reinforce eroded trails or repair damaged infrastructure. Its integrated winch system would be invaluable for clearing storm debris, such as fallen trees that obstruct trails or pose safety risks. The ATV's Turf Mode ensures minimal impact on delicate surfaces, such as grass and wetland areas, making it equally effective at Bonnie Wenk Park and Towne Lake Park.

Currently, manual transport of materials limits the productivity of workdays, especially in remote areas. Volunteers often expend significant time and energy on tasks that could be expedited with the right tools. **Most notably, getting materials to worksites has been challenging during workday events sometimes consuming our entire work effort.** The Polaris Sportsman X2 570 ATV, with its superior hauling, towing, and maneuvering capabilities, is the ideal solution for addressing these inefficiencies.






