


Thirty Keel 16 Jone Begun and hel out resolution proving an amend and to the Constitution of the traited states CHAPTER CXXVIII An Act to define and declare the rights of persons lately known as Slaves, and Free Persons of Color. Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas, That all persons heretofore known as slaves, and free percons of color, shall have the right to make and enforce contracts, to sue and be sued, to inherit, purchase, lease, hold, sell, and convey real, personal and mixed estate; to make wills and testaments, and Seels or radio and enjoy the rights of personal security, liberty, and private property, and all remedies and proceedings for the protection and enforcement of the same; and there shall be no discrimination legis against such persons in the administration of the criminal laws of this State. Sec. 2. That all laws and parts of laws relating to persons lately held as slaves, or free persons of color, contrary to, or in conflict with the provisions of this act, be and the same are hereby repealed; Provided, nevertheless, that nothing herein shall be so construed as to repeal any law prohibiting the intermarriage of the white and black races, nor to permit any other than white men to serve on juries, hold office, or vote at any election, State, county, or municipal: Provided, further, that nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to allow them to testify, except in such cases and manner as is prescribed in the Constitution of the State. Approved November 10, 1866.

Throckmorton, Governor of Texas, is an impediment to the reconstruction of that state under the law; he is thereby removed from that office. E.M. Pease is hereby appointed in place of J.W. Throckmorton, removed. He will be obeyed and respected accordingly"


