

Forrest "Bud" Ward is Mr. Quality of Life in McKinney.

He has had a long and rich history of contributing to the Quality of Life for the residents of McKinney.

Bud is very worthy of this honor not only for his endless dedication to volunteering in many areas, but also because he is a joy to work with, is always willing to pitch in, he has unwavering patience, and he never gives up when most people would. He is a dedicated leader and all-around asset to our community.

Bud is a past Board Member of Habitat for Humanity and participated in several build projects.

Bud is a past Board Member of Meals on wheels and currently is a driver delivering meals to shut-in residents of McKinney.

Bud is a current teacher for AARP Foundation Safe Driver Program.

Bud is a current volunteer for McKinney Seniors Helping Seniors, a non-profit of volunteers that provide complementary home repairs for McKinney Seniors and disabled residents.

Bud participates in Trinity Disaster Recover Team, the TDRT takes on a minimum of two one week local or remote projects to assist families in need, either from natural disasters or who have been

deemed in need with home repairs. They have traveled to Oklahoma, Houston, New Orleans, and North Texas locations.

Bud is currently leading AARP Foundation Tax-Aide for McKinney

Filing federal taxes are more complicated and stressful now than ever with significant changes related to Covid relief. Very few taxpayers are aware of these changes.

In addition, social distancing challenges associated with Covid-19 Pandemic makes is more difficult for individuals to safely get their taxes prepared.

AARP Foundation Tax-Aide led by Bud Ward has partnered with the City of McKinney Library System for 10 years to offer free tax preparation services by IRS certified counsellors. In a normal year, this group of volunteers led by Bud Ward can service 1200 citizens of McKinney and surrounding communities.

This offering significantly improves the quality of life for our citizens by providing a very valuable service at no cost which would cost hundreds of dollars if the same services were purchased from paid providers. The citizens are also relieved to know their taxes are accurate because they are prepared by IRS certified counsellors and individually reviewed for accuracy before being electronically filed at no cost for the taxpayer.

Bud began planning with his leadership team this summer to offer socially distanced tax preparation services. The process had to be designed in detail with the site plan approved by the parent AARP Foundation Organization. Planning included many detailed steps:

PPE had to be identified and acquired.

A scheduling system had to be designed to replace the previous walk-in first come first served process.

A 2-way phone contact system using Google Voice had to be put in place.

Scripts had to be written to assist phone volunteers to handle taxpayer questions.

Information packages for taxpayers had to be designed, printed, stuffed, and distributed to libraries for distribution.

Volunteers had to remotely trained vs. traditional in-person including creation and delivery of training materials.

Volunteers had to be certified thru IRS and Tax-Aide certification process which includes working assigned problems and successfully completing certification testing.

Bud had to work with the library to design a physical layout to support the workflow that is socially distanced to protect the volunteers and taxpayers.

A tax document inventory system had to be designed to inventory every document the taxpayer was leaving for tax preparation. The system also is used when taxpayers return for their completed return to ensure all documents are returned to the taxpayer.

A chain of control system had to be designed to document everyone that handles the return.

After caring for the citizens of McKinney and his fellow volunteers, Bud also finds time for family and friends.



To Whom It May Concern:

Kim has been active in the McKinney area since she purchased a house in the historic district in the mid 1990's. She is a Registered Professional Civil Engineer (licensed in multiple states), and together with her husband Martin, they opened their business in McKinney in 2005 – Sanchez and Associates, LLC, an urban planning and engineering consulting company. Since then, Sanchez and Associates, LLC has evolved into a full land development, real estate and investment company: TSAG, LLC (TSAG) Kim is the CFO of the firm which manages nearly 100,000 sq feet of commercial real estate property, over \$3 million in residential real estate and has been responsible for over \$1 billion in new developments throughout the State. TSAG works with investors and clients from across the U.S. as well as international investors from Taiwan, India, Belgium, and the Middle East.

As CFO of TSAG, Kim has been an ardent supporter of housing choices that are affordable for McKinney residents. Under Kim's leadership, TSAG worked with Groundfloor Development, L.P. (GFD) and the McKinney Housing Authority to satisfy the "affordable housing" lawsuit with ICP (Inclusive Community Partners) regarding affordable housing in McKinney. In conjunction with GFD, TSAG obtained local and state entitlements, garnered local support and was ultimately key to obtaining 9% Tax Credits for the development of Millennium and Post Oak Apartment Communities (both located on McKinney Ranch Parkway at opposite ends). Next, TSAG teamed up with Carleton Group (CG) and the McKinney Housing Authority to provide local, state, and federal entitlements, local financial and community support and project expediting for the redevelopment of Newsome Homes (under the RAD program) and Merritt Homes (under the 9% Tax Credit Program). These four (4) developments have added over 600 apartment units that are reserved for McKinney residents in need of affordable housing options. TSAG has provided technical and expertise support for affordable housing options throughout Texas with clients from Indiana, Florida and Georgia – projects located in McKinney, Bonham, Sherman, Dallas, Austin, and the Rio Grande Valley.

Since moving to McKinney, Kim has been a servant leader without the desire for accolades or recognition. Kim and her family split their time and they are active members of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in McKinney and St. Phillip's Episcopal Church in Sulphur Springs. In McKinney, she has served on the Altar Guild, capital campaigns, and as a youth director. At St. Phillip's in Sulphur Springs, Kim serves on the Altar Guild, coordinates Sunday programs for children and promotes the St Phillip's website and Facebook pages.

Kim focuses a great deal of her time with her two beautiful daughters; always teaching them the importance of being servant leaders and giving back to their community. Kim has volunteered hundreds of hours at Imagine International Academy of North Texas (IIANT) where her daughters attend school. Kim has been an active volunteer at IIANT as a "school mom", fundraising efforts and chaperoned countless school trips in Houston, Austin and locally. She has also been an active volunteer for various Girl Scout troops.

Kim was a member of Junior League of El Paso and Junior League of Plano as well as a Board Member for Holy Family School in McKinney for 10 years. While with the Junior League of Plano, Kim volunteered with the Plano Children's Advocacy Center and the Rape Crisis Center. She has just completed a tenure on the McKinney Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors (term expired December 2020). Kim continues to be an active supporter of Hugs Café by raising money and awareness - touching the lives of so many great people and families. Kim's daughters (9 and 13) have been donating to Hugs Cafe since the inception: Christmas Money from Grandma; Birthday Money from friends and family; lemonade stands; and selling many of their gently used toys. Kim founded Sanchez Charities, LLC in 2017 to focus her company's and her family's personal charitable giving through a strategic, systematic approach. Through the Sanchez Charities, LLC, Kim launched "McKinney Little Free Pantry" (MLFP) to help provide emergency food sources to the hungry. The idea was simple: "Take what you need; Leave what you can". The original "pantry" started with a used piece of furniture she and her daughters purchased from the Habitat for Humanity's Re-store Store. This mission has flourished and has brought multiple churches, denominations, civic groups and many volunteers together to advance this simple and yet worthy cause. With her group of volunteers, MLFP services twelve (12) locations throughout McKinney. Kim has cultivated a "servant based" philosophy for TSAG and Sanchez Charities, LLC. The list of individual donors and other participants is too great to list. Suffice it to say that Kim's persistence and focus has brought together a community focus on hunger. Strategic partners have made the goal of eliminating hunger a real and tangible possibility. In fact, the Junior League of Plano has now recognized <u>The</u> **McKinney Little Free Pantry** as an eligible organization for service hours for its members.

100% of all proceeds collected are used to address hunger. The MLFP also distributes clothing, blankets, gloves, toiletries, and feminine products. The McKinney Little Free Pantry's administrative costs are shouldered by individual philanthropists and entities such as Secured Title of Texas, Love Life Foundation, TSAG, Sanchez Charities, LLC, Chase Partners, and many others. Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, MLFP has been distributing nearly 20,000 lbs. of food per month – all items of food, coats, gloves, socks, hygiene essentials, etc., have been donated, coordinated, and distributed by Kim and her army of volunteers. MLFP is funded 100% by donations and grants. Every year, Sanchez Charities through the MLFP adopts multiple families throughout the holidays for gifts, necessities, food and, more importantly fellowship and hope.

In 2017, Sanchez Charities formed a strategic alliance with AEYL, Derick and Ceretha Robinson. Together, they have sponsored community drives to support families in need of school supplies, backpacks, water bottles, lunch pails, tutoring, mentoring, etc. IIANT contributes water bottles, lunch pails and backpacks while Valliance Bank and BancorpSouth have contributed direct funds for school supplies.

In 2018, TSAG, through one of its subsidiaries, entered into a private-public-partnership with the City of McKinney to build a parking garage in downtown McKinney. As that project neared completion, Kim partnered with the City Arts Program to implement the 5-story mosaic/mural on the parking garage that faces Virginia – "<u>McKinney Blooms</u>". Kim contributed 50% of the cost for that artwork which was commissioned from Reginald Adams from Houston, TX. Later, Kim worked with Amy Rosenthal and MainStreet to co-locate one of the "Monarchs of McKinney" butterflies adjacent to McKinney Blooms. Kim believes community artwork is yet another way for McKinney to celebrate its history and its future.

In 2020, Kim partnered with Jason Hernandez to apply for a grant from the McKinney Community Development Corporation to clean up the Mexican Cemetery located at Pecan Grove on SH 5 and Industrial Drive. MCDC awarded the grant to commission a statue to commemorate the history and heritage of the Mexican-American community that were critical in McKinney's evolution. Kim also worked with Angela Poen to make the Community Garden Kitchen become a reality. For years, the idea of the Community Garden Kitchen has been an elusive but noteworthy concept. Kim was able to help Angela navigate through the City's development process and Angela and her team are now under construction immediately east of Holy Family School. Also, in 2020, Kim began work on "The Mustard Seed" – a center for non-profit management to be located on White Street just east of Redbud Blvd. Kim's goal for The Mustard Seed is to have an office campus where the various not-for-profit organizations in and around McKinney can co-locate for synergy and improved impact. The Mustard Seed will also have a "one-stop" intake center to help residents access and navigate the myriad of services and service providers. The property purchase contract is scheduled to close in February 2021 and architectural and engineering plans are underway.

Kim embodies the spirit and meaning of <u>Quality of Life Award</u>. Through the years, Kim has given hope to the hopeless; shared with those in need; comforted those in distress – all without seeking or wanting recognition. It is with great pleasure, that we, the undersign, nominate Kim. D. Sanchez, P.E., CFO and Founder of The Sanchez Charities, LLC for the <u>MCDC Quality of Life Award</u>. Jump Into Art began in 2011 at a room in the McKinney Art House and has expanded ever since.

"Jump Into Art is a safe environment where we play with a variety of different mediums and work with visiting artists, and we just let everyone create," Dia said. "We are here to develop the whole person through nurturing, and when they get positive feedback from their peers, they feel better about themselves."

Although Dia is quick to tell her students she is not a classically trained artist, she said her background as a concierge provided her with the skills to be a "solver of all problems."

"For art, I do tons of research to break it down, so I know how to show my students to achieve what they desire," she said. "They learn mosaics, 3-D, watercolor, clay, batik—you name it."

Dia said the path to her own art studio was a perfect storm.

After taking classes at McKinney Art House, owner Sona Knox needed someone to run the studio's birthday party program.

"And she asked me if I wanted my own room," Dia said. "I prayed about it and took on the room, and instantly my classes

tripled in size and I outgrew my space there."

The most popular classes at Jump Into Art are the after-school and home-school multimedia classes.

"We do everything under the sun," she said. "This isn't a paintby-number studio. It's about letting me guide them through their creativity with loving kindness."

Secret Santa allows the 1800+ Meals on Wheels clients to ask for a few items they would like to receive at Christmas. Volunteers purchase those items, wrap them and they are delivered to the seniors. These are huge undertakings requiring staffing, logistics, volunteers, and a tremendous amount of manpower. With both of these projects back to back Peggy starts working in August to get things rolling. Several thousand packages are delivered in this time frame and a vast majority of these are in McKinney. For many of their clients, it is the only gift they receive during the holiday period. Peggy lines up companies, churches and individuals who all help to make this happen. This year, as with everything, COVID-19 made this a much larger logistical challenge. Peggy couldn't utilize the MOW facility where the daily meals are prepared so she had to find someone to donate a large space to warehouse items and act as a dispatch point.

She worked with The Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints Church in McKinney who allowed use of their space to insure these programs were able to go on this year. This truly becomes a community effort, but none of it is possible without Peggy's dedication, leadership and determination. Here are some comments from folks who received boxes and gifts this year. I would like to nominate a TRIO of Alliance of Elite Youth Leadership, Community Lifeline Center, and Mike Redeker for the collaboration for the food distribution HUB during the 2020-2021 COVID-PANDEMIC.

When our nation endured one of the most horrific and life changing pandemics since the 1918 Influenza Pandemic that ravaged our nation. The 2020 Coronavirus Virus (COVID -19) has equally ravaged our nation and world. This has been a epidemic unlike anything in my generation has ever seen. To date COVID-19 has claimed over 509, 000 lives in the US with 712 of those in Collin County.

This pandemic not only has caused loss of lives it has also impacted families with the loss of jobs, income, food, and housing. Many families were one paycheck away or one paycheck behind on providing basic necessities for their families like food. With the impact of the shutdowns and closing of businesses many families did not know where to turn.

Through the amazing leadership of Scott Elliott (Executive Director – CLC), Derrick Robinson (Founder - AEYL), and Mike Redeker (300 Throckmorton – property owner). These amazing servant leaders and their team partnered with USDA and other Food Partners like North Texas Food Bank and Hello Fresh to create a food distribution center. This distribution HUB serves as the central HUB in East McKinney that has provided so many families in need with some relief.

In March 2020 they immediately went into action to find ways to help struggles families with basic necessities.

#### In March 2020 Dec 2020:

- They held 36 Food Distribution Days
- Distributed 728,600 LBS of Food
- Served Approximately 3,452 families

#### Jan 2021 to date

- To date they have held 3 Food Distribution Days
- Distributed 30,800 LBS of Food
- Served Approximately 429 Families

Not only did this Team of Servant Leaders coordinate the volunteers, deliveries, and distributions they assisted other organizations such as local churches, apartment complexes, and neighboring communities in Plano and Princeton to create similar models at their locations.

During Thanksgiving, they distributed 200 turkeys to families and at Christmas they distributed toys to families who did not know how they were going to buy toys for their children.

I have personally witnessed the selfless efforts of their team and the volunteers that show up every time to help make this partnership/collaboration successful. They have distributed in the rain, sleet, and snow to ensure families had their basic necessities.

In 2018, the orchestra started a Christmas Concert tradition, putting on one of the most unique Christmas concerts in the region.
