The McKinney Downtown Business Re-Development Board of the City of McKinney, Texas met in regular session at the McKinney Performing Arts Center, Ruschhaupt Hall, 111 N. Tennessee Street, McKinney, Texas on Thursday, April 15, 2021 at 8:30 a.m.

McKinney Main Street Chairman Robert Hamilton called to order the meeting of the McKinney Downtown Business Re-Development Board at 8:33 a.m. after determining a quorum present. Chairman Hamilton called for the City Liaison Report. Councilman Franklin updated the Board on the upcoming Byron Nelson Golf Tournament, only 3 weeks away, lots of planning and working going on, will be a great event for the City.

# **21-0282** Director's Report

Chairman Hamilton called for the Director's report. Ms. Rosenthal reminded the Board about the upcoming Chamber Community award; we have 4 seats at the Main Street table. The east McKinney projects open house was March 31, the online presentation is available for those

not able to attend. There will be volunteer opportunities at the Byron Nelson for Board members and staff if anyone is interested. Early voting is going on, and election day is May 1, a run-off will be needed if no candidate is over 50%. Main Street received the sales tax for January 2021, is was down 2%. The light-up Louisiana project is ongoing, with another update planned for April 20. The Parking consultant study findings will be presented to City Council in May. The Dash shuttle has been utilized at the vaccination hub but will be returning to service downtown at the end of April. On Tuesday, April 20 Main Street will present an update to City Council on the silo project. Our next board meeting is May 13 and we would like to return to in person meetings. Ms. Rosenthal welcomed Gregory Hearns as the new Special Events Coordinator.

sent out. We had a few wind challenges during the event and the

construction zone presented some challenges but overall, the event went
