## Recycled Concrete






### Regulatory Overview

- ♦ Texas Commission for Environmental Quality (TCEQ)
  - ♦ Air Quality The Permanent Standard Permit is site-specific & issued through the TCEQ Main Office in Austin. Its limitations include:
    - ♦ Facility cannot operate at night
    - ♦ Operation is limited to 2640 total operating hours/year
    - ♦ Production is limited to 200 tons/hour
    - $\diamond$  Equipment is limited to 1 primary crusher, 1 secondary crusher, 2 screens, 1 grizzly feeder & engines limited to 1000 total HP
    - & All facilities shall be located a minimum of 200 feet from the property line
    - \* All facilities shall be located a minimum of 1/4 mile from any residences/schools/churches
    - $\ensuremath{\diamond}$  All facilities must meet New Source Performance Standards opacity limitations





### Regulatory Overview (Con't)

- ♦ Texas Commission for Environmental Quality (TCEQ)
  - ♦ Industrial Stormwater Permit (TXR05)
    - ♦ Governed by the EPAs NPDES program
    - \* Requires implementation of stormwater control measures (BMPs)
    - \* Requires development of written plan and training of facility personnel
    - ♦ Requires compliance monitoring
    - $\ensuremath{\diamond}$  Includes BMP strategies for managing fugitive dust

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## Regulatory Compliance

- ♦ Air Permit
  - ♦ Visible emissions limitations at the property line
  - ♦ Must meet Best Available Control Technology and minimize dust associated with the facility
  - ♦ Water truck will be used daily as needed onsite
- ♦ Stormwater
  - ♦ Regular Inspections and Training
  - $\Leftrightarrow \ Water \ Quality \ Limits \ on \ runoff \ discharge$

#### Our Position on this Matter

  There have been recent, as yet unfulfilled, resolutions to close existing cement plants (which happen to be in relative regional proximity to the new location. These existing locations have already been cited numerous times for inability to properly maintain EPA mandated standards with regards to health and pollution issues as well as nuisance issues.

  City Staff has been quoted to be in opposition (within just the last two years) can yfacilities of this kind. It is important to reflect on what has precipitated the changed in opinion. See original article with quote.

  We are concerned with the proximity of this proposed facility to the Lavon/Wilson Creek watershed and the many toxic chemicals that will, inevitably, run off. These chemicals will harm the environments through which they travel, their wildlife inhabitants, and, ultimately, end up in our drinking water supply. The proposed location actually even has a marked tributary of Wilson Creek located directly adjacent to the property.

  The City attempted to push through a similar plan for a nearby location last fall, however, when given a chance to fully express their voice in the matter, the voters overwhelmingly turned it down. Have the voters have changed their mind?
