CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING

APRIL 4, 2023

The City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas met in regular session in the City Hall Council Chambers, located at 222 N. Tennessee Street, McKinney, Texas, on Tuesday, April 4, 2023 at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Fuller called for Council and Manager Comments.

Council member Charlie Philips recognized McKinney student-athletes who participated in the recent Texas Relays national Track & Field event with ninety-two (92) high schools represented in each of the two divisions of the event. McKinney North High School Boys 4x400 relay team of Taylor Briggs, Dakaylen Tyler, Jayden Walker, and David Walker, placed fourth. Cole Dauper (McKinney High School, sophomore) ran the 100m sprint in a time of 10.6 seconds. Council member Philips encouraged everyone to support the athletes of Special Olympics which will be held April 6 in McKinney Council member Geré Feltus mentioned representatives from McKinney recently visited the Texas Legislature; commended former Council member Frederick Frazier who is

currently serving as a State Representative and doing a great job; praised Director of Strategic Services Trevor Minyard for always being well prepared to address the Legislature on behalf of the city; and thanked City Manager Paul Grimes and Assistant City Manager Barry Shelton for their work in the State Capitol as well. Council member encouraged everyone to register to vote for the May 6 Elections before the deadline of April 6; thanked the Dawoodi Bohras organization for inviting the Council to an event to celebrate of Ramadan and to learn more about the group's mission in the community who have been serving the community since opening their doors last year. Council member Feltus attended the recent NAACP annual luncheon and CUTX In Living Color event, both recognizing those who provide outstanding community service.

Mayor Pro Tem Rainey Rogers stated he attended the Texas Legislative Session for the first and thanked everyone who voted for State Representative Frazier who is doing work for the city of McKinney, as well as the other representatives he was able to meet; and thanked Director Minyard for his work. Mayor Pro Tem Rogers recognized and encouraged McKinney student Matthew Johnson who earned a perfect score on the ACT test.

Council member Justin Beller expressed appreciation for the Dawoodi Bohras community for their recent event and ongoing community service; recognized the fifteen (15) year anniversary of the Embrace organization which supports families through adoption and foster processes; and recognized the PACCAR facility in McKinney which has been refitted to produce battery-operated Peterbilt vehicles.

student robotics and STEM program: within one year of operation the McKinney

Renegade has qualified for the State competition and has formed a remote robotics

course in which the students will teach women in the country of Uganda.
