 Boys and Girls Clubs of Collin County is requesting \$71,477 to purchase traditional games and electronic games (Exergame) that will encourage physical health and development of youth attending the McKinney Club.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- Boys and Girls Clubs of Collin County has a 50-year history in North Texas.
- Strategically located in low-income neighborhoods, BGCCC provides a safe, positive environment during after-school hours.
- The BGCCC serves 3,050 members and works with other local nonprofit organizations to

- identify youth that need assistance.
- In 2020, the McKinney club served 488 registered members; provided 23,224 meals and snacks and logged 60,350 homework hours completed.
- 50% of members qualify for free/reduced lunch.
- Programs offered through the McKinney club include Education, the Arts, Health and Wellness, Leadership and Service and Sports and Recreation.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY:

- Funds allocated for FY22 for discretionary Project Grants is \$2,177,223.00, and \$74,885.50 in funds remain unallocated.
