ITEM SUMMARY:

- McKinney Community Development Corporation will conduct a public hearing on a retail development infrastructure grant application submitted by CPJK, LLC (dba Gather) for exterior infrastructure improvements at Gather, 207 East Virginia, McKinney
- The scope of work to replace the grease trap includes excavation, installation of new piping, rerouting of a vent, installation of a new outlet, and water testing on piping and interceptor.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- Gather is a small venue in Historic Downtown McKinney. Established in 2011. The venue hosts weddings, receptions, parties and business gatherings.
- In May 2021, the venue's grease trap started overflowing. Last inspection had

- been conducted in April 2021.
- To be fully functioning and able to host events with food/beverage, the property requires a new grease trap.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY:

- Funds allocated for FY21 Retail Development Infrastructure Grants is \$120,000. Remaining budget balance is \$70,000.
- This is a matching grant program, with maximum grant funding limited to \$25,000 per grant.
- The request is eligible for MCDC consideration under Section 501.103 of the Texas Local Government Code.
