- Approval of the Recommendation.

ITEM SUMMARY:

- This item authorizes the application for and acceptance of, if awarded, a Collin County Parks and Open Space Funding Assistance Program grant for the Greens of McKinney trail project and other related improvements.
- The application submission deadline to Collin County is July 11, 2022, with an award

announcement in October of this year.

- This project will include a 12' trail along the west side of Wilson Creek through the Greens of McKinney park property. This trail will begin where a new pedestrian bridge is being designed across Wilson Creek to the north and will terminate at the south end of the property.
- Together this pedestrian bridge and proposed trail will provide a continuous trail connection from Towne Lake to Highway 5.
- Currently there is a 4-6' wide cart path that runs throughout the property. This path is in poor condition in many places. This new trail will take the place of the cart path and will be appropriately sized as well as designed to meet all ADA standards as well as enhance the user experience.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- Upon award, the project will be ready to begin design utilizing a landscape architect from the City's approved vendor list.
- This project will continue the linear park and trail system along Wilson Creek, the spine of our parks and trails.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY:

- This funding program requires a 50% match from the City. Staff is still evaluating the exact grant request amount, which will be determined when this item goes to Council.
