 - Texas Music Revolution on June 6-7, 2025, in Downtown McKinney.
- Both events will draw attendees of varied demographics from across North Texas.
- Texas Music Revolution attendance is expected to be over 9,000. HippieFest attendance is expected to be

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- Established in 2018, Texas Homegrown Music is more than just a radio show and podcast - it is a movement dedicated to spotlighting emerging artists.
- Several signature events are hosted including a stage at the Texas Music Revolution, Maylee's

HippieFest, and the Texas Homegrown Summer Music Series featuring regional musicians and hosted at The Sanctuary.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY:

- MCDC's allocation for Promotional and Community Event grants for FY 25 is \$250,000 -- \$125,000 for Cycle I applicants and \$125,000 for Cycle II applicants.
- This is the first request for a promotional grant submitted by Raining Grace (Texas Homegrown Music).
