BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- The Neathery Estate is a bed and breakfast located in Historic Downtown McKinney.
- Built in 1915, the home is listed on the National Historic Register. The home was restored in 2018 and now supports tourism in Downtown McKinney.
- The infrastructure improvements are necessary to increase safety and security for guests and to improve the guest experience.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY:

 Funds allocated for FY21 Retail Development Infrastructure Grants is \$120,000. Remaining budget balance is \$70,000.
